#### PRESENT,

#### The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council,

WHereas the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council, of the 27th of January last, for paying the respective Bounties therein mentioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and also to all Able-bodied Landmen. who should voluntarily enter themselves in His Majefty's Royal Navy; And likewife for paying the Rewards to Perfons discovering Seamen who fhould conceal themfelves, will expire upon the 29th Day of this Inftant February-And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given fhould be continued to be paid for some Time longer : - His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, that the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to fuch Seamen and Landmen respectively, who shall, on or before the 31st Day of March next, enter themselves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majefty's Proclamation of the 11th Day of November laft. And likewife that the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Perfons who fhall, on or before the faid 31st Day of March next, discover any Seaman or Seamen, who shall conceal themselves, fo as fuch Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majefty's Service. Stockholm, March 9. The King has confirmed the Senate's Choice of Baron de Scheffer to be Governor to the Prince Royal. We are affured, that Orders are fent to Carlfcroon, to equip fix Frigats, which are to cruize this Summer in the Baltick. The Weather is fet in fo mild in this Country, that the Rivers and Lakes are already free from Ice.

Dantzick, March 10. Within these few Days past, a great Quantity of Timber, for building Houses, &c. has been shipped off from this this Port for Lifbon. According to our laft, Advices from Nimerow, the Contagious Diftemper, which cealed for fome Time in the Neighbourhood of that City, is broke out again; and that the greatest Precautions are al-The ready taken to prevent its fpreading. Small Pox continues to make great Havock in this City.

Copenhagen, March 13. On Saturday laft the King went to fee the Squadron that is equipping in this Port ; after which his Majefty went to the Dock-Yards, and viewed the Ships The King has appointed on the Stocks. Wednesday the 21st of next Month to be obferved as a Day of Fafting and Humiliation throughout this Kingdom. Laft Wednefday one Lazare, a Jew about thirty Years of Age, was publickly baptized in the Chapel at the Palace, and named Frederick Jules, the King and Queen, the Queen-Mother, and the Princels Charlotte, standing Godfather and Godmothers. Great Numbers of the Nobility and Gentry, of both Sexes, were prefent on this Occafion.

Bruffels, March 18. On Saturday laft, being the Birth-Day of the Archduke Joseph, On Saturday laft, who then entred into the 16th Year of his Age, Prince Charles of Lorrain, our Governor General, received the Compliments of the Nobility and Gentry on that Occasion.
