As we are deeply fentible of the invaluable Liberties and Privileges we enjoy under your Majefty's aufpicious Reign, and how inimately connected our Profperity is with the Prefervation of your most precious Life, and the Succession of your Royal and Illustrious House, we are determined on all Occasions, at the Expence of our Lives and Fortunes, to support and defend the fame.

Rome, April 10. Last Week the Abbe Arrigoni prefented to the Pope divers Sorts of natural Curiofities, for which he expressed great Satisfaction, and immediately ordered them to be packed up, and fent as a Prefent to the Speculam of Bologne. The Pope has given to M. Acciaioli, his Nuncio in Portugal, the Abbacv of St. Sebaltian, worth about four hundred Crowns a Year, as an Indemnification for the L fies he suffained by the late Earthquake at Libs: ; for which Places feveral Mafons and other Workmen have been hired in this City, by the Portuguele Minister, to be employed, with many others alread filembled from feveral Parts of Italy, in rebuilding that City. On the 28th paft the Marquis Steinville, the French Ambaffador, attended by the Gentlemen of the College of Cardinals, Prelates, Foreign Ministers, Roman Princes, &c. in their respective Matters Coaches and Six, being 104 in Number, made his publick Entry into this City in Cardinal Valenti's Coach; and being attended by his Officers and Domefticks in rich Liveries, he proceeded to the Quitinal, and was in:roduced to an Audience of the Pope, by whom he was prefented with the usual Prefent of Eatables, which were carried to his Palace by 36 Servants; and on the 4th Instant he had his first publick Audience of the Pope, in which he prefented his Credentials. On both these Occafions his Attendance, which were very numerous, had each Day a new and expensive Li-On the 5th the Pope held a Confiftory, very. in which he made a Promotion of nine Cardinals in Favour of the Nomination of the crown-The Republick of Venice's Nomied Heads. nation is fuspended till the Difagreements between them and the Pope are reconciled. The fame Day feveral Couriers were dispatched .by the Foreign Minifters to their respective Courts with Notice of the faid Promotion, and with the Names of the Gentlemen appointed by the Pope to carry to the new created Cardinals the Caps, viz. The Abbe Count Puebla to Vienna and Coftanza; M. Durini to France; the Abbe : Count Mandelli to Spain ; the Abbe Prince Corfini, jun. to Portugal, and M. Millo to Turin. The fame Day Cardinal Archinto received the Cap from the Pope, and on the 7th the Cardinal's Hat.

Florence, April 17. Laft Week Mr. Acton, Commodore of the Emperor's Ships of War, fet out for Leghorne and Port Ferraio, with Di-

rections from the Regence to fit out fome of the Emperor's Veffels to cruize on the Ceafts of Tufcany against the Aigermes. On the 10th the Members of the Regency retired into the Country to pass the Holy Week, during which all Business will be at a Stand.

Yefterday a Meffage was delivered to the Honourable Houfe of Commons by Major General Conway, Secretary to the Lord Licutenant, acquainting them, that the Chair was vacant by their late Speaker's being called up to the Houfe of Peers, and that it was his Grace's Pieafure that they fhould proceed to the Election of a new Speaker; whereupon the Right Honourable John Ponfonby, Efg; was proposed and elected Speaker; and this Day the Lord Lieutenant went to the Houfe of Peers, and being feated on the Throne with the ufual Ceremony, his Grace fent for the Commons, and approved of their Choice of a Speaker.
