

some Share of Favour. The Captain Pascha went out on the 8th Instant with four Men of War and some Gallies; He has had the Dignity of the three Tails conferr'd on him by the Grand Seigneur. The Polish Minister Count Mpiſzeck, who is sent by the King and Republick to congratulate the Sultan on his Accession to the Throne, arrived here on the 11th Instant, with a Retinue of near 200 Persons: He is at present confin'd to his Chamber on Account of a fore Leg, which obliges him to postpone his Visits of Ceremony.

Naples, April 20. The Six Chebecks, which sailed from hence some Weeks ago on a Cruize against the Corsairs of Barbary, are returned into Port, without having been able to meet with any of those Pyrates. Mount Vesuvius continues to throw out great Quantities of inflammable Matter.

Genoa, April 24. On Saturday last an armed Bark and a Pink, on board of which were 150 Soldiers, sailed from hence for the Island of Corsica, to which Place the Government is preparing to send further Reinforcements.

Rome, April 25. An Account is arrived here of the Death of Cardinal Henriquez, Legate of the Romagna. The Pope has been slightly indisposed for some Days past, notwithstanding which a Consistory was held on Monday last at the Quirinal, when the Bishoprick of Tamasso, in the Island of Cyprus, was conferred on the Sieur Belingeri, Dean of the Cathedral Church of Pavia; that of Oria, in the Pouille, on Don Francis-Anthony Del-Re; and that of Gerace, in the Further Calabria, on Don Peter Dominick Scopa.

Stockholm, April 27. The King is at present indisposed with a Fever, which however his Physicians are of Opinion will not be attended with any fatal Consequences.

Copenhagen, May 1. Last Week the King disposed of several Military Employments, when M. Juel was promoted to the Rank of Colonel of Horse; and M. de Rosencrantz, Captain in the Regiment of Foot of Drontheim, was appointed Aid de Camp to his Majesty. We have received an Account from Frederickshall, that Major General Wieregg, Governor of that Place, died there on the 15th of last Month.

Hague, May 13. Yesterday the States of Holland and Westfrizeland opened their Assembly; and this Morning a Deputation from the Province of Zealand, consisting of seven Persons, was conducted to the said Assembly by Count Bentinck. The Deputies of the different Colleges of the Admiralty of these Provinces are also assembled here upon the Affairs of their Department. Last Tuesday Morning the Burghers of this Place were drawn out under Arms according to annual Custom, and were reviewed by her Royal Highness the Princess Governante, the young Prince Stadtholder, and the Princess Caroline his Sister, attended by several General Officers.

Captain Brett, Commander of His Majesty's Ship the Chichester, is arrived at Plymouth, and brought in with him a French Ship, bound from Rochfort for Mississippi, with a Quantity of Arms and Ordnance Stores, 140 Soldiers, and 30 Women, which was taken by Capt. Rowley, Commander of His Majesty's Ship the Harwich.
