Naples, April 20. The Six Chebecks, which failed from hence some Weeks ago on a Cruize against the Corfairs of Barbary, are returned into Port, without having been able to meet with any of those Pyrates. Mount Vesuvius continues to throw out great Quantities of in-

flammable Matter.

Genoa, April 24. On Saturday last an armed Bark and a Pink, on board of which were \$50 Soldiers, failed from hence for the Island of Corfica, to which Place the Government is preparing to fend further Reinforcements.

An Account is arrived Rome, April 25. here of the Death of Cardinal Henriquez, Legate of the Romagna. The Pope has been flightly indisposed for some Days past, notwithstanding which a Consistory was held on Monday last at the Quirinal, when the Bishoprick of Tamasso, in the Island of Cyprus, was conferred on the Sieur Belingeri, Dean of the Ca-thedral Church of Pavia; that of Oria, in the Pouille, on Don Francis-Anthony Del-Re; and that of Gerace, in the Further Calabria, on Don Peter Dominick Scopa.
