Brussels, June 22. The French King's De-claration of War against his Britannick Majesty, The French King's Dedated at Verfailles the 9th Instant, was published at Paris the 16th. We are informed, that the laft Advices, received by the Court of France from Minorca, are of the 6th Inftant, and that their Contents are kept very fecret : All the French Letters however agree, that there is a great Mifunderstanding between the Duke of Richelieu and the General Officers of his Army, and that they have been obliged to change their Attack against St. Philip's Castle, which is defended with great Skill and Bravery. Princefs Charlotte of Lorrain arrived here on Sunday Evening from Mons, and fat out Yesterday in the Afternoon for Flanders, with his Royal Highness Prince Charles, in order to vifit the most remarkable Places of that Province.
