#### Naples, May 29.

AST Week four of our Gallies, that failed fome Time ago on a Cruize against the Barbary Corfairs, returned into Port, without having been able to meet with any of those Pyrates. We have received Advice, that the Ships which failed from nence with feveral rich Prefents for the Grand Signior, and his Officers, are fafely arrived at Conffantinople.

On Thursday last the Berlin, June 15. King returned from Pomerania, and this Morn ing his Majefty fet out from Poizdam for Magdebourg, in order to review feveral Regiments that are ordered to affemble in that N ighbourhood. We have received Advice from Embden, that the Ship called the Prince of Pruffia, be longing to the Afiatick Company of that Place, is arrived there from Canton in China.

Cologn, June 18. We have received an Account, that the Hereditary Prince of Saxe Getha died on the 9th of this Month, in the 21th Year of his Age.

Himburgh, June 18. The Day before Yefterday M. Mauritius, Minister from the State. General, arrived here in a Yacht from Am-stredam, who succeeds M. Buys in this Refi dence, upon his having been appointed fome Months ago a Member of the High Council at the Hague. The King of Denmark is not ex-

pected back at Copenhagen till To-morrow. Hague, June 22. The States of Holiand and Weftfrizeland will open their Affembly Tomorrow, for which Purpole most of the Mam bers are already arrived. Yefterday Baron Mulert, who was lately appointed Deputy on the Behalf of the Province of Overyfiel to the Contege of the Admiralty of Amsterdam, took the usual Oaths, in the Affembly of the States-General, to qualify himfelf for that Employment.

Brugels, June 25. According to our Advices from the Frontiers, the French continue fail to fend more Troops from thence into Normandy and Brittany. Among the reft, we are inform-

ed, that the Regiments of Picardie and Normandie, each of four Battalions, are on their March thither. The last Letters from Minorca fay, that on the 6th Instant, the Grand Battery of the Befiegers began to play with great Succefs, and had at first confiderably filenced the Fire of the Garrison, which however had been renewed the next Night with the fame Vivacity as before.
