Naples, May 29.

LAST Week four of our Gallies, that sailed some Time ago on a Cruize against the Barbary Corsairs, returned into Port, without having been able to meet with any of those Pyrates. We have received Advice, that the Ships which sailed from hence with several rich Presents for the Grand Signior, and his Officers, are safely arrived at Constantinople.

Berlin, June 15. On Thursday last the King returned from Pomerania, and this Morning his Majesty set out from Potsdam for Magdebourg, in order to review several Regiments that are ordered to assemble in that Neighbourhood. We have received Advice from Ambden, that the Ship called the Prince of Prussia, belonging to the Asiatick Company of that Place, is arrived there from Canton in China.

Cologn, June 18. We have received an Account, that the Hereditary Prince of Saxe Gotha died on the 9th of this Month, in the 21st Year of his Age.

Hamburgh, June 18. The Day before Yesterday M. Mauritius, Minister from the States-General, arrived here in a Yacht from Amsterdam, who succeeds M. Buys in this Residence, upon his having been appointed some Months ago a Member of the High Council at the Hague. The King of Denmark is not expected back at Copenhagen till To-morrow.

Hague, June 22. The States of Holland and Westfrizeland will open their Assembly To-morrow, for which Purpose most of the Members are already arrived. Yesterday Baron Mullert, who was lately appointed Deputy on the Behalf of the Province of Overysfel to the College of the Admiralty of Amsterdam, took the usual Oaths, in the Assembly of the States-General, to qualify himself for that Employment.

Brussels, June 25. According to our Advices from the Frontiers, the French continue still to send more Troops from thence into Normandy and Brittany. Among the rest, we are inform-

ed, that the Regiments of Picardie and Normandie, each of four Battalions, are on their March thither. The last Letters from Minorca say, that on the 6th Instant, the Grand Battery of the Besiegers began to play with great Success, and had at first considerably silenced the Fire of the Garrison, which however had been renewed the next Night with the same Vivacity as before.
