**LONDON BRIDGE.**

*The Committee for putting in Execution the Act of Parliament for improving, widening, and enlarging the Passage over and through London Bridge, do hereby give Notice, That the following Tolls are payable for passing through the said Bridge, which commenced the 25th of June last, viz.*

*For every Hoy, Barge, Vessel, Lighter, or other Craft, having any Goods on Board not exceeding five Tons Burthen, for every Time any such Craft shall pass through any of the Arches of the Bridge, Two pence.*

*Not exceeding Ten Tons, Three-pence.*

*Not exceeding Twenty five Tons, Six pence.*

*And above the Eurther of Twenty-five Tons, One Shilling.*

*And if any Owner or Owners of any such Hoy, Barge, Vessel, Lighter, or other Crafts, shall neglect or refuse to pay the said Tolls or Rates, for the Space of three Months after the same shall have passed through the Bridge, he and they are to forfeit and pay for every Offence Five Pounds: But no Toll is payable for Crafts loaded only with Straw, Manure, Dung, Compost or Lime for Tillage.*

*And the Owner or Owners of every such tollable Hoy, Barge, Vessel, Lighter, or other Craft is, and are also, after the 20th of September next, to forfeit Twenty Shillings every Time the same shall pass through any of the Arches of the Bridge without having the Name or Names, and the Place or Places of Abode, of the Owner or Owners thereof, painted on some conspicuous Part of such Hoy, Barge, Vessel, Lighter, or other Craft, as also the Tonnage thereof.*

*And the Committee being empowered to compound or agree by the Year or otherwise, with the Owner or Owners of any such tollable Craft, to pass through the Arches of the Bridge, for such Sum of Money, and to be paid in such Manner as they shall think fit or reasonable: Such Owners may apply for that Purpose to the Committee, who sit Weekly at Guildhall, on Tuesday, at Five in the Afternoon.*
