

A PROCLAMATION.

HEREAS His Majefty hath Signified unto us His Royal Pleafure, that the Parliament of this Kingdom, which now ftands Prorogued

to Tuesday the Twentieth Day of this Instant July, be further Prorogued to Tuesday the Twenty-fourth Day of August next; We do therefore Publish and Declarc, that the faid Parliament be, and accordingly the faid Parliament is, hereby further Prorogued to Tuesday the Twenty-fourth Day of August next; Whereof the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Commons in this present Parliament, are to take Notice accordingly.

GOD Save the KING.

Rome, June 26. Information having been received at Court, that fome Barbary Corfairs are cruifing on our Coafts, Orders are difpatched to the Commander of the Pope's Gallies, to fail immediately in Queft of them. The King of Portugal has fent to the Pope his Nomination to the eight vacant Bishopricks in that Kingdom, which will be published in the next Consistery. On the 18th Instant, the Conftable Colonna notified in Form to the Pope, that he is appointed his Neapolitan Majesty's Ambaffador Extraordinary for prefenting the white Hackney at the enfuing Feast of St. Peter. Copenhagen, June 29. The King has con-

ferred on Lieutenant General Numfen, Comnandant of this City, the Rank of Field Marshal, and on Major General Dehn, that of Lieutenant General of the Forces of this Kingdom.

Vienna, July 3. On Wednesday last the Emperor set out with a numerous Revinue for Hollitich, and is expected back at Schonbron the Beginning of next Week. Count Rofenbourg, Minister from this Court to that of Spain, has received his last Instructions, and is preparing to fet out for Madrid. A few Davs ago feveral Pieces of heavy Artillery, and a great Quantity of Ammunition, were taken out of our Arfenal and fent away for Olmutz. They talk of a Camp's being to be formed this Summer in Bohemia, and another in Moravia; however it is certain, that feveral Regiments have received Orders to hold themfelves in Readinefs to march.

Florence, July 6. On the 24th palt, being the Festival of St. John, Count Richecourt, by Commission from the Emperor to represent his Person on that Occasion, received, with the ufual publick Formalities, the Homage from the respective Cities, Towns, and Feudatories of Tuscany, being attended by the chief Nobility, and all the different Magistrates.

We are informed by Hambourg, July 9. our last Letters from Pomerania, that the feveral Pruffian Regiments, quartered in that Dutchy, have Orders to hold themfelves ready to march upon the first Notice; and that every Thing is getting ready for their Encampment.

We are credibly inform-Brussels, July 16. ed, that the chief Occasion of Marechal de Belle Isle's and M. de Paulmy's Journey to Dunkirk, was to make the proper Dispositions for re-eftablifhing the Fortifications of that Place, which the French Court is refolved to render even more respectable than before its Demolition.
