Yesterday the Three Princesses, a Ship belonging to our Asiatick Company, arrived here from Bengal, with a very rich Cargo.

Vienna, Aug. 28. Last Monday the Regiment of Foot of Arenberg arrived here, and the next Morning was reviewed by the Archduke Joseph, accompanied by Count Bathiani, and other Officers of Rank. They made a very handsome Appearance; and, when the Review was over, continued their March for the Camp
