#### Malta, August 10.

H E Grand Mafter, who a few Days ago was extremely ill, is now per-fectly recovered. On Wednefday fectly recovered. last two Algerine Corfairs were brought into this Port. They were taken by fome of our Gallies, after a smart Engagement, in which feveral were killed and wounded on both Sides.

Petersbourg, Aug. 18. The Diftemper amongst the Horfes, which broke out lately in feveral-Places on the Road from hence to Novogroc, having entirely ceased, the Detach-ments of Troops ordered there to prevent its fpreading, are returned to their respective Quar-ters. Their Imperial Highness the Great Prince and Great Princefe, who have been for fome Time peft at Oranienbaum, returned hithe. last Thursday. Nuples, Aug. 18.

Four of our Chebecks, that returned into Port a few Days ago to take in fresh Water and Provisions, put to Sea again Yesterday to continue their Cruize on the Coaft of Calabria.

Leghorn, Aug. 23. Three Dutch Men of War, commanded by Rear Admiral Wassenaer, came into our Road a few Days ago to take in fome Refreshments, and Yesterday Morning they failed again, in order to fecure their Levant Trade from falling into the Hands of the Algerine Corfains.

Rome, Aug. 28. The Duke of Modena has nominated the Advocate Bellandi to be his Minister at this Court, in the room of the Abbe Paluzzi, deceased. The Pope's Gallies having been refitted at Civita Vecchia, are failed on a Cruize against the Barbary Corfairs. On the 21ft Initant, being the Anniverfary of the Pope's Coronation, the fame was celebrated with the usual Solemnity. Cardinal Valenti died at Viter'so on the 29th.

His Royal Highness the Turin, Sept. 1. Duke of Savey continues mending, but has not yet appeared in publick.

Florence, September 4.
