" Is Majesty was this day pleased in Council, 10 Command, That the following Orders and Refotutions fould le forthwith Printed and made Publick.

His Majefly was pleafed this day in Council to Declare, That he found it neceffary that the Laws which were made for the fafety and prefervation both of Church and State, should

That he found it neceffary that the Laws which were made for the fafety and prefervation both of Church and Stare, fhould lie put in execution, with more care and diligence, then of late they have been; and that having long fince Commanded His Judges. to do their Duty herein; He had alfo lately advi-fed with feveral of His Elfhops, and upon due Confideration off the whole Matter, had Refolved, and doth therefore Order, Is That the Convidions of Popilh Recufants be encourag-ed, quickened, and made effectual; and to this end His Ma-jefties Attornev-Ceneral is required forthwith to inform him-fiff what Convidions are already certified into the Exchequer, and to caufe fpeedy Procefs to iffue upon them. And it is further ordered, That Letters be forthwith fent from this Beord, div ded to the Judices of Peace within the feveral Counties, Cities, and Places of this Realm, thereby requiring them with all fpeed, to certify his Majeities Attofney-General what Convictions of Popilh Recufants are preparing, and what hinders the compleating of them, and whether a-ry Perfons of Quality, who are infpeaded to be Popilh Re-cufants, have been omitted to be Prefented, and what ob-fructions they find therein ; And His Majefity Declares, that upon due information thereof, care fhall betaken that they upon due information thereof, care shall be taken that they

upon due information thereof, care Ihali betaken that they may be fpeedily removed. II. And His Majefly doth Declare His further Pleafure, and doth ftricily Charge and Command, That no Perfon or Perfons, of what Quality or Condition fever he be, do pre-tume to fay Mafs in any part of this Kingdom, the Chappels of the Queens Majefly, and the Chappels of Forreign Mi-nifters only excepted: and to prevent all extraordinary Re-fort to thole Chappels, It is further Ordered and Declared, That if any Perfon or Perfors fhall prefume to repair to thole theorem a Menial Servant of Her Majefly, or of That it any Perion or Perions nian premier to repart to the Chappels, not being a Menial Servant of Her Majefty, or of fuch Forreign Mindiers, and fhall there willingly hear Mafs, every juch Offender fhall fuffer the forfeiture of 100 Marks, and one years impriforment, as by Law is provided. And and one years impriforment, as by Law is provided. And for the better difference of fuch Offenders, His Majeflies third part of the faid Penalty fhall be also given to the Informer, for his further reward and encouragement. And morenver, all Officers are required to apprehend fuch Of. fenders, and to caufe them to be examined and proceeded with according to Law- And a'l Mayors, Juffices of Peace, and other Officers and Minifers, to whom it fhall or may apper-tain, are also Ordered and Required to caufe diligent featch and enquiry to be made into all other places, where they fhall hear or fufficient that Mals is privately Celebrated, to the ord, that the Officient be brought to caufier the end, that the Offenders may be brought to condigne punifhment.

III. And His Majefty doth Command and Forewarn all Persons born within any of His Majesties Dominions, who Perfans born within any of rils majerites Lominous, weo have taken Orders by any authority derived from the Church or see of *Kome*, and are now remaining in any part of this Kingdom, and out of prifon (except Mr. *Iohn Huddlefton*, who was eminently leiviccable to His Majefty in His eleape from *Worcefter*) that they depart the Realm before the 25 from *Worefler*) that they depart the Realm before the 25 day of *Maich* next enfuing, and that they prelime not to re-turn again, nor any other fuch Priefls to come over after that day; His Majefly Declating, that He will caufe the ut-most penalities of the Law to be infleted upon the Contemners of this His Command ; And Mr Attorney-General is Required to prepare a Proclamation accordingly. And His Majefty doth allo Command all fuch Priefts, who have ta-And His ken such Orders, and do pretend a priviledge to attend upon the Queens Majeliy, or upon lorreign Ministers, to depart this Kingdom likewise by the time before appointed, and to leave the Ceurt within 14 days after notice of this Order, whereof Publication shall be forthwith made, by causing the fame to be affixed upon the Court Gates, a.d in fuch other places as shall be thought convenient.

IV. And His Majefly doth further Forewarn, and Command all His subjects, that they prefume not to fend any Perfon or Perfons to be Educated in any Popifh Colledges or Seminaries beyond the Seas; and if any Notice or Information can be given of any that have been already fent, and are there dill remaining. His Majefty Declares, that he will give Or-der for a Privy Seal to be directed unto them, and there by Command them to return home with all fpeed, as they will anfwer the contrary at their peril. And it the Parents of Guardians of fuch Perfon fo Educated abroad, be living, and within His Majeftics Dominions, His Majefty will allo Comwithin His Majeftics Dominions, His Majefty will alfo within His Majeftics Dominions, His Majefty will alfo Com-mand fuch Parents or Guardians to fend for their Children or Papils home, and caufe them to return, upon peril of furf fering the utmost penalties of the Law, in that cale provided. V. And if any of His Majefties Natural-born Subjects, be-

V. And it any of His Majetties Natural-born Subjects, be-ing Papift, or reputed Papift, fhall prelume to come into His Majefties Palace at Whitebal or St. James's, or into an, other place where His Majefties Court fhall be, contrary to His Majefties late Prohibition; His Majefty Declares, that He will punift that Contempt with exemplary Severity, according to the quality of the Offender; who, if he be a Peer of the Realm, fhall be fent to the Tower; if under that quality, to fome other Prifon. fome other Prifon.

VI. And His Majefty doth further order and appoint, that via And His Majelly doth further order and appoint, that effectual care be taken for the fupprefilion of Conventicles gAnd whereas divers pretend Licences from His Majefty, and would fupport themfelves by that pretence, His Majefty De-clares; that all His Licences were long fince Recalled, and that no Conventicle hath any Authority, Allowance, or En-couragement from His Majefty.

Vienna, Fan. 27. On Monday last parted hence the, Train of Artillery, appointed for the fervice of the Army, which his Imperial Majefly intends to have in Silefia, under the Command of General Cobs; the next day 58 Waggons followed, laden with all forts of Am-1 munition, and to morrow General cobs likewife parts, hence, to put himfelf at the head of the faid Troops, which it is faid, and to joyn with those of the Elector. of Brandenburg. The Count of Oxensterne, Ambafof Brandenburg. The Count of Oxensterne, Ambai-sador of smeden, finding this Court will not admit of the reasons, which the King his Master has for his proceedings against the Elector of Brandenburg, but that on the contrary, his Imperial Majefty fends Forces against him, is preparing for his departure from hence, no room being now left kim to hope to fucceed in his Negotiation here. The Count de Souches is not under-Arreft, as hath been faid, but continues fo far in the Emperors disfavour, that he cannot obtain an Audience of his Imperial Majefty. We have the confirmation of the defigne of the Turks upon Rdab, by means of the intelligence they had with the Governor of it, a Hungarian, who had already privately brought into the Town 200 Turks, but the German Soldiers in Gartifon there, difcovering them, fell upon them, and de froyed them, and made their Governor prisoner, to be proceeded against according to the Emperors Order.

Hamburg, Feb. 1. Our laft Letters from Ponicren rell us, that the Swedes have feized a certain Pals called Fedenick, and fince are marching farther to wards Ruppin, and Havelberg, and fo approach nearer to Silefia, having reinforced their Troops with feveral. Hungarians, and others, who voluntarily come and but those Troops that are in the joyn them, ukker, and New marke, lye ftill in their former Quarters. We cannot yet certainly learn what measures the Ring of Denmark refolves to take, in this conjunct ure of affairs.

Bruffels, Feb. 5. From all the French Frontiers we receive an account of the great preparations they are every where making against the next Campagne, which makes
