Their High Mightinesses have ordered back into their Dominions five Batallions of the Troops which they have at Tournay, Menin, Ypres, Furnes and Knocke. We are now positively informed that the Troops which the French are fending to the Affistance of the Empress Queen, are to be affembled at Psaltzbourg on the 17th Instant, under the Command of the Prince of Soubize.
