AST Monday arrived in our Road four Dutch Men of War, commanded by Baton Wallenaer. They are only to ftay here a few Days to take in fresh Water, and then to proceed to the Coast of

Italy, in order to protect the Trade of their Nation from the Algerine Corfairs. Rome, Dec. 5. The Pope, who a few Days ago was very much indifpofed, and confined to his Bed, is now greatly recovered. 'Tis faid that the eight vacant Hats, in the Sacred Col-lege, will be difpofed of fome Time next Month. By the late Difpolition of our Troops in the Romagna, the numerous Bands of Smuglers in that Country are almost dispersed, and we hear of but very little of that Kind of illicit Trade being carried on there. We hear that the Differences which have fublifted, for fome Time paft, between this Court and that of Venice, are in a fair Way of being amicably adjusted in a fhort Time, through the Mediation of the Court of France.

Aladena, Dec. 7. We are informed by our last Letters from Turin, that the Count de St. Laurent, his Sardinian Majefty's Minister and Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, died there a few Days ago.
