WO Bashaws, who, in the late Troubles at Tunis, took Refuge on board the Maltefe Gallies, having declared their Intentions to turn Chriflians, they are now inftructing, in order to be baptized, and their Neapolitan Majesties are to be Sponfors. The Pope has granted a yearly Penfion to his Surgeon, who attended him in his late Indifposition. A Te Deum is ordered to be fung, on the 5th Inftant, for the Pope's Recovery, and a Confiftory is fixed for the 6th, in which many Bifhopricks, and other vacant Benefices, are to be filled up.

Florence, Dec. 11. On the 29th paft an Edict was put up, at the usual Places in this City, notifying to the Publick, the Convention flipulated between this Government and the Republick of Genoa, for the mutual Reftitution of Criminals who fhould take Refuge in The faid Convention is founded either State. on the fame Conditions as those with the King of Naples, the Pope, and other neighbouring States. On the 8th Inftant, being the Emperor's Birth-day, the Nobility and Foreign Mi-nisters appeared in their rich Habits; but, as Count Richecourt was indifpofed, no Body received the ufual Compliments on that Occafion.

Madrid, Dec. 13. On Occasion of the Catholick Queen's Festival, on the 4th Instant, his Catholick Majefty made the following Promptions. Lieutenant General Marquis de Victoria, Director General of the Catholick King's Land Forces, was made Governor General of the fame. The Marifcal de Campo Don Alfonfo Fernandez de Heredia was made Governor and Captain General of the Province of Yucatan and District of Campeachy, in the Place of the Marifcal de Campo, Don Melchor de Navarrete, who had obtained his Demiffion. And the Brigadier of Foot, Don Lucas Fernando Palacio, was made Governor and Captain General of the Town of San Augustin, and the Pro-

vinces of the Florida, in the Place of the abovementioned Don Alfonso Fernandez de Heredia. On the 28th of last Month died here, in the 70th Year of his Age, the Marquis de la Regalia, Dean of the Council and Chamber of the Indies, and Member of feveral Junctos relating to the Commerce and Revenues of this Kingdom.
