IS Pruffian Majefty continues to enjoy a good State of Health, and attends Divine Service regularly on Sundays. On Wednesday last the Prussian Regiment of Horfe of Rochau returned here from Zittau in Upper Lufatia, as did alfo the next Day the Regiment of Foot of Manteuffel. The Officers of these Regiments affure us, that they found no Enemy in those Parts; and that all the Reports of Actions and Skirmifhes in that Country, confifted only of a Defign of the Auftrians to plunder the Quarters of a Company of Pruffian Huffars; but that the Huffars being apprized thereof, foon repulfed the Auftrians, fome of whom they took Prifoners and conducted to Zittau. Within thefe few Days paft feveral covered Waggons, loaded with coined Money, to the amount as 'tis faid of a Million, arrived here from Berlin. By Dispatches from Warfaw of the 22d of last Month, received Yesterday, we are informed, that the Republick of Poland will not only abide by its Neutrality, but will also oppose any Attempts that may be made by the Russians to force a Passage through Poland.

Frankfort, Jan. 5. The Body of Austrian Troops, that passed the Rhine a few Days ago at Worms, Spire, and Oppenheim, continue their March by the Way of Franconia; and are foon to be joined by the Regiments which the Elector of Mentz and the Bishop of Wurtz-bourg have engaged to furnish the Empress They have not only begun to raile Queen. Recruits in this City, but also at Friedberg and Wetzelar, for forming a Regiment of 2000 Men, with which the Duke of Deux Ponts has agreed to furnish the French; and as all French Deferters, who left their Regiments before the first of September last, have Liberty to inlist, it is thought this Regiment will be foon compleat. According to our laft Advices from Alface and Lorrain, they continue to amass great Quantities of Provisions and Forage in those Provinces, where fresh Troops are almost continually arriving.

Bruffels, Jan. 14. All the Advices received from Paris confirm, that the French King is paft all Manner of Danger from the Wound that was given him on the 5th\*Inftant. Upon fearching the Villain, who perpetrated this horrid Fact, there were found in his Pockets, a Copy of the New Teftament, and 20 Louis d'Or, 19 of which were in Gold, and the other in Silver. So confiderable a Sum, for a Man who had no other Trade but that of felling Powders to take Spots out of Cloths, gives fome Reafon to fuspect, that there are other Accomplices concerned in the Plot. The Parliament (who fince the laft Bed of Juffice had ceafed all Functions) has met again upon this Occasion : But a particular Commission has been appointed by the King, for enquiring into this Affair, and trying the Affaffin. Prince Charles of Lorrain

has received Orders to repair to Vienna, and will fet out, as it is thought, in a fhort Time.

#### War Office, Nov. 30, 1756.

WHereas it has been reprefented to the King, that there are at this Time feveral Deferters from the different Corps in His Majefty's Service; His Majesty hoping, that such Deferters may be hereby induced to return to their Duty, and that this Inflance of His Clemency will have a due Influence on their future Behaviour, is pleafed to grant His most Gracious Pardon to all Deferters from His Majefty's Land Forces, who shall surrender themselves on or before the last Day of January next to the refpective Corps to which they belong ; or who shall within the fame Time furrender themfelves to any other Corps in His Majesty's Service, to the Intent they may either be fent to their proper Corps, or ferve in any other, according as His Majefty may be pleafed to direct ; this Pardon not to extend to any Perfons now in actual Cuftody for their Defertion, nor to fuch, who may at any Time before the faid laft Day of January next, be apprehended or challenged as Deferters, unless upon their being to apprehended or challenged, they do immediately make. known the Corps from which they have deferted.

And whereas feveral of the faid Deferters may have inlifted in other Corps, and be now ferving therein, His Majefty is likewife gracioufly pleafed to grant His Pardon to all fuch Offenders, (not being in actual Cuftody for the fame) and alfo to declare, It is His Royal Intention, that they fhall continue to ferve in the Corps in which they now are, without being molefted or reclaimed by the Officers of the refpective Corps to which they did formerly belong.
