LAST Week the Chevalier de Cumiana, Knight of the Order of Malta, and Governor of the City of Casal, died suddenly of an Apoplexy, in an advanced Age.

Brussels, Jan. 18. The French King is said to be very near perfectly recovered of his Wound: But the Letters from Paris inform us, that they were still entirely in the Dark as to the Motives that could induce the Assassin to commit so execrable an Attempt upon his Majesty's Life. Princess Charlotte of Lorraine is arrived here from Mons, to take Leave of the Prince her Brother, who purposes to set out for Vienna some Time next Week.
