Rome, January 1.

IRCULAR Orders from the Magiffrate of Health have been directed to the refpective Ports of the Ecclefiaftical State, intimating to them the Reduction of the Quarantine to a Fortnight, on Notice that the Peftilential Sicknefs was ceafed in the Levant. The Pope's Health is fo much mended within thefe few Days, that it is now thought he may live fome Time. On the 30th, he admitted fome People to an Audience; and the fame Day Cardinal Guadagni fent printed Notifications to the Churches of this City, directing them to fufpend the Form of Prayers entitle. Bruffels, fan. 21 The Letters from Paris continue to give the most favourable Accounts of the French King's Health, and fay, that his Majefty had even already dined in Publick. An Ordonnance has been lately published in France, for augmenting to 705 Men each, the fix Regiments of Foot belonging to the Irifh Brigade, and the two Scotch Regiments of Ogilvy and Royal Scotch. By another Ordonnance 1200 Men are to be added to the Corps d'Artillerie ; which is now to confift of 96 Companies of 50 Men each, divided into fix Battalions of 16 Companies each, whereof two of Sappers, nine of Gunners, and two of Bombardiers. There are likewife to be raifed a new Company of Miners, and one of Workmen to be added to the ten which already belong to the Corps d'Artillerie.

The Day of Prince Brussels, Jan. 25. Charles of Lorrain's Departure for Vienna is not yet known; but his Royal Highnefs will cer-tainly fet out fome Time this Week. The The Princels his Sifter, who was here to take Leave of him, returned to Mons Yesterday. A few Days before her Royal Highness left this Place, the received an Express with the News, that on the 18th Instant she was elected Coadjutrix of the Abbey and Principality of Essen. The Letters from France advise, that the Villain who made an Attempt upon the French King's Life, has been removed to Paris, and confined in the Prifon of the Conciergerie; and that Letters Patent have been paffed, by which the whole Cognizance of this Affair, and the Trial of the Prisoner, are committed to the Grand Chambre of the Parliament.
