PURsuant to an Act of Parliament passed in the 26th Year of His Majesty's Reign, this is to give Notice to the Concerned, that Information hath been sent to this Office, That the John Snow, Joshua Young, Master, bound from Charles Town in South Carolina for Leverpoole, laden with 100 Hogheads of Sugar, 170 Casks of Rice, six Pipes of Wine, two Ton of Logwood, two Hogheads of Pepper, and a large Quantity of Indico, having put into Ramsey Bay in the Isle of Man by Strefs of Weather, was, on the 23d past, at Seven in the Morning, in a violent Storm, drove from her Moorings to Sea, and stranded about Twelve o'Clock at Night, on a large Bed of Rocks at a Place called Lowca Point, in the Parish of Harrington, in the County of Cumberland, and was immediately beat to Pieces, and the Captain, Pilot, and all the Crew, consisting of eleven Persons, were drowned, except John Youds, an Apprentice on board, who was cast on Shore; and that Henry Curwen, Esq; the Lord of the Manor, hath secured, for the Benefit of the Owners, Part of the Materials, Rigging, Sails and Cables of the said Ship, four Carriage Guns, two Casks of Indico, and a small Quantity of Logwood.

Treasury Chambers, March 15, 1757.

Several Persons having been prosecuted, by the Order of the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, (of which Order Notice was given in the London Gazette of Saturday the 23d of October last) for selling several Tickets, called Irish Tickets, to be determined by the drawing of the last State Lottery, in defiance of the Laws made against such Practices, two of which Persons, viz. Mr. John M'Carrick and Mr. Henry Lunn, were, on Tuesday the Eighth of March Instant, convicted of the said Offence, before the Right Honourable the Lord Mayor, and Sir Robert Ladbroke, Knight, one of the Aldermen of the City of London, on the Statute made in the Eighth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, Chap. 2. Sect. 36. which inflicts a Penalty of 500 l. and one Year's Imprisonment in the County Goal,

without Bail or Mainprize, on every Person so convicted.
