The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council, of the First of March last, For paying the

respective Bounties therein menti-oned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and alfo to all Able-bodied Landmen, who fhould vofuntarily enter chemfelves in His Majefty's Royal Navy; and likewife for paying the Rewards to Perions differences Seathen who should conceal themfeires, will expire upon the Twelfth Day of this Indust April: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, fhould be continued to be paid for fome Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, and or Trinity similings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Land-man, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to fuch Seaman and Landman re-formed in the fact of the Twenty fpectively, who fhall, on or before the Twelfth Day of May next, enter themfelves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majefty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January laft : And likewife, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Perfons who shall, on or before the faid Twelfth Day of May next, difcover any Seaman or Seamen who fhall conceal themfelves, fo as fuch Seamon or Seamon be taken for His Majefty's Service. Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.
