The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council, of the First of March last, For paying the respective Bounties therein mentioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and alfo to all Able-bodied Landmen, who should voluntarily enter themselves in His Majesty's Royal Navy; and likewise for paying the Rewards to Persons discovering Seamen who should conceal themselves, will expire upon the Twelfth Day of this Instant April: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, should be continued to be paid for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to such Seaman and Landman respectively, who shall, on or before the Twelsth Day of May next, enter themselves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majesty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January last: And likewise, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Persons who shall, on or before the faid Twelsth Day of May next, discover any Seaman or Seamen who shall conceal themselves, so as such Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majesty's Service. Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

Rome, April 2. The Government, on Notice that many Corfairs from Algiers and Tunis are cruizing on the Roman Coasts, have sent Orders to Civita Vecchia, for the Pope's two Frigates, St. Peter and St. Paul, to sail immediately in Quest of those Pyrates, who greatly interrupt our Commerce. The Magistrate of Health, the better to prevent the many Irregularities which have lately been introduced in admitting Vessels into the Ports of the Ecclesiastical State, hath caused an Edict to be published, prescribing, under the severest Penalties, the Arica Observance of the Rules therein contained. On the 28th past the Pope held a private Confistory in his Apartment in Bed, in which he disposed of five Archbishopricks, and seven Bishopricks, and other Ecclesiastical Benefices, which, on Account of his Indisposition, had been long suspended. On the 29th the Cardimals Spinelli, Pastionei, Cavalchini, Paolucci, Millo, Argentveillers, Archinto, and M. Rota, held a Congregation in the Pope's Bed-Chamber, relating to the Difagreements between the See of Rome and the Republick of Venice. At the Departure of these Advices, the Pope's Health was grown much worfe.
