The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council, of the Ninth of April laft, For paying the respective Bounties therein mentioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and alfo to all Able-bodied Landmen, who fhould voluntarily enter themselves in His Majesty's Royal Navy; and likewife for paying the Rewards to Perfons difcovering Seamen who fhould conceal themfelves, is near expiring : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, fhould be continued to be paid for fome Time longer ; His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to fuch Seamen and Landmen refpectively, who fhall, on or before the Thirteenth Day of June next, enter themfelves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majefty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January laft : And likewife, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Perfons who fhall, on or before the faid Thirteenth Day of June next, discover any Seaman or Seamen who shall conceal themfelves, fo as fuch Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majesty's Service. Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

Madrid, April 25. On Wednefday the 20th Inftant their Catholick Majesties set out from

AT the Court at St. James's the roth Day their Palace de Buen Retiro for Aranjuez, where they arrived the fame Day in perfect Health; and where they are to be attended, by the whole Court, during the usual Time of the present Sealon, molt of the foreign Ministers having already repaired thither. Bruffels, May 10. The laft Advices arrived

here from Bohemia are of the 30th of April, at which Time Marshal Brown was affembling his Army at Mikowitz, about two German Miles from Prague, and half-way between that Place and Welvarn. The main Army of the Prufilians, commanded by the King, was then at Schlan, and posted in such a Manner, as to make it very difficult (as it is apprehended here) for the Corps under the Duke of Aremberg, which was marching from Pillen, to join Marshal Brown. According to the fame Advices, Count Konigfegg, with the Troops from Reichenberg, was arrived at Brandeis, about three German Miles from Prague, and General Serbelloni had quitted his Camp at Koniglgratz, and was then arrived at Nimbourg. It feems as if the French had laid afide, for the prefent, their Defign of befieging Gueldre. The Prince de Condé is expected here on the 14th Instant, in his Way to the Army, and will be followed on the 16th by the Duke of Orleans. Yesterday Morning Prince Ferdinand de Ligne, a Field Marshal, and Colonel Proprietor of a Regiment of Dra-goons in the Empress Queen's Service, was found dead in his Bed.

N. B. The Norwich Mail contains the following Bags, viz. Norwich, Swaffham, Attliborough, Wind bam, Thetford, Lynn, Stoke, Bury St. Edmunds, New Market, Saffron-Walden, Cambridge, Bishop Stortfurd, Saubridgeworth, Downham, Epping, Ongar and Ely. The Man who committed this Robbery is deferib-

ed to be a middle fized Man, and had on a white or very light coloured Riding Coat, with a plain Hat-He rode a brown or dark coloured little Horfe, with a fwifh Tail.
