oned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and alfo to all Able-bodied Landmen, who fhould vo-Juntarily enter themfelves in His Majefty's Royal Navy; and likewife for paying the Rewards to Perfons difcovering Seamen who fhould conceal themselves, is near expiring : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, fhould be continued to be paid for fome Time longer ; His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able bodied Land-man, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to fuch Seamen and Landmen re-forship who thell fpectively, who shall, on or before the Thirteenth Day of June next, enter themselves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majesty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January last: And likewife, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Perfons who fhall, on or before the faid Thirteenth Day of June next, difcover any Seaman or Seamen who fhall conceal themfelves, fo as fuch Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majefty's Service. Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

Admiralty-Office, May 21. By a Letter from Capt. Geary, of His Majefty's Ship Somerfet, dated Cove of Kingfale 4th Inftant, there is an Account, That on the 29th of last Month, at Half past Four, A. M. His Majesty's Ship the Rochester made the Signal for feeing a Sail in the N.E. Quarter, which the Somerfet and Rochefter gave Chafe to, and at 11 D°. the Rochefter made the Signal for feeing four more Sail in the fame Quarter; but there being little Wind, the Somerfet and Rochefter did not near them but very little before

tha

the Clofe of the Evening, when they all bore E. N. E. at the Diftance of about five Leagues. In the Night a Breeze of Wind foringing up in the S.W. Quarter, Capt. Geary fhaped a Courfe in order to fall in with them in the Morning, and at Dawn of Day discovered them near each other, about two Leagues Diftance in the N.W. Quarter. They confifted of three Ships, one Snow and a Schooner, upon which the Somerfet and Rochefter immediately chafed the two largeft Ships, which, on difcovering the Somerfet and Rochefter making Sail towards them, bore away to the Northward, and the other three hauled to the N. W. and before Noon that Day, the Somerfet and Rochefter took them, in the Latitude of 46 D. 59 M. North, and Longitude 5 D. 8 M. Weft from the Lizard, one named the Renomee, Burthen 350 Tons, laden chiefly with Pork, Flour, and 200 Mulquets; the other the Superb, Burthen 750 Tons, laden with some Provifions, Bale Goods, and feveral Cafes of Small Arms, both Letter of Marque Ships, from Bordeaux 12 Days, bound to Quebeck, having on board 242 Officers and Soldiers of the Royal Regiment of Foreign Voluntiers, which, with the Seamen and Paffengers, amounted to 391 Prifoners. Capt. Geary writes, that fince the above Account he had got the Particulars of the Arms and Powder on Board the faid two Ships, viz. a 40 Barrels of Powder, and 5 20 Muskets, and Bayonets, &c. for the Troops at Canada. The Rochefter, Capt. Duff, who went in Pursuit of the other French Vessels, did not fall in with any of them; but, on the 3d Inftant, in the Latitude of 47 D. 30 M. North, and Longi-tude of 11 D. 40 M. Welt from London, took the Poffillion Privateer, with 70 Men on Board, belonging to St. Jean de Luz. She had been 13 Days out of Port, but had not taken any Prize. They had difabled the Veffel fo much by fawing her Gunnels and Beams while Capt. Duff chafed her, that he judged it necessary after taking out the Prifoners to burn her,

Lieutenant Clements, of his Majefty's Ship Unicorn, has fent an Account, that, on the 30th of April, about Five in the Morning, they faw and gave Chace to a Privateer from St. Maloes, called the Invincible, mounting 24 Guns, 9 Pounders, and 286 Men, and on the 2d Instant, at Five in the Morning, came up with and en-gaged her, in Lat. 50 N. and 120 Miles to the Weftward of Scilly ; that during the Action Captain Rawling, Commander of the Unicorn, being fhot dead, he, Lieutenant Clements, took the Command and continued the Action 'till the Privateer ftruck, which was after an En-gagement of an Hour and a half, in which the had killed and wounded between 40 and 50 Men, and the Unicorn had the Boatfwain, Armourer, and a Marine killed, and five Men wounded. The Prize had on Board the Captain, Lieutemant, Surgeon, and 45 private Men, belonging to a Guernicy Privateer, which they had taken on the 28th of April near Scilly, with their Confort of 24 Six Pounders in Company, who had taken on Board half the Guernfey Prifoners,

The Invincible was carried to Crook Haven, where the arrived on the 4th, and the Prifoners landed on the 8th Inftant. On the 9th the Uni-corn failed again in Queft of the Invincible's Confort, called the Comtessie de Noailles Snow Privateer, belonging to Bordeaux, of 14 Guns, 6 and 4 Pounders, and 143 Men on Board, which he came up with the next Day in Lat. 50 D. 20 M. North, and 9 D. Weft Longitude from London, and took her, after exchanging three Broadfides, and has carried her to Kinfale, where fhe arrived the 12th Inftant, and landed her Prifoners the next Day. And on the 17th Inftant the Unicorn arrived at Plymouth with her faid two Prizes, the Invincible and Comteffe de Noailles.
