Marfeilles, February 12. Rom Sicily we have advice, that fince the ar-

rival of the French succors under the Command of the Marquels de Vallavoir at Meffina, the affairs there had greatly mended a the Meffineses, with the assistance of the French, having retaken feveral confiderable Posts from the Spaniards near the City. That the faid Marquels was lodged in the Palace of the Viceroy, and was treated by those people with extraordinary respect and kindness. That on the other fide, the Spaniards were bringing all the Forces they could together, with defign formally to befiege them. We expect fuddenly to hear of the arrival of Monsieur de Vivonne at Meffina, who parted hence the 29 of the last month. As well here, as at Thoulon, is preparing a third fuccor to be fent thither; though we doubt not but the Spanish Fleet, which Cruises before that place, will strive to keep all affiltance from coming to it by Sea for the future.in which perhaps they may not be more fuccefsful, than they were in their endeavors to prevent the fuccors that the Marquefs de Vallavoir abovementioned, brought the Meffinescs.

Naples, Febr. 12. The Spaniards begin to draw their Forces together in Sicily, in order to a formal befieging of Mefsina; in which, by the favor of those Posts they already posses in which, by the favor of those Posts they fuccess, though they might have been more consident of it, had care been taken to oppose the passage of the Marquels de Vallavoir, who brought those Inhabitants a coninderable fuccour; however it is faid here, that those Provisions are almost confumed, and that if the Duke de Vivonne, who is an his way with a farther Supply, can be hindred from entring into Mefsini, those Inhabitants may yet be reduced in a flort time to an extream neceffity for want of Corn ; and till they are reduced theretunto, it may be feared our Forces by Land will not be able to effect any great matter.

Warfaw, Febr. 19. Our last advices from the Court tell us, That 16 or 17000 Tartars, under the Com of Nuradin Sultan, approached the Ukraine, and were already come fo near our Troops, that feveral confiderable skirmistes had passed between them, which had bitherto (praifed be God) terminated with advantage on our fide, many of the Enemy having been killed and taken Prisoners. That the 25 pass, the Bassa of Silistria, with fome Thousands of Turks and Tartars under his Command. appeared near Ratzkow, a place of import-ance in the Ukrain, poffeffed by our Troops; upon which, the Sieur Karitzki, who Commanded there, fent our what Cavalry he had, with certain fmall Field-pieces, to attack them ; that accordingly there had been a fharp difpute between them, the Poles doing great execution upon the Enemy with their Cannon, but that the Colonel Przeworski, who Commanded our men, being killed upon the place, they were forced to retreat into the Town. That the Enemy purfued their point, and having notice, that the place lay open towards the Nieper, entred it on that fide without any opposition, and had already begun to fet fire to it in feveral places, when, the Sieur Koritzki, fallying out upon them with what Troops he had from leveral Cloyfters, he forced them to retire again in great confusion, about 30 Houseshaving been burnt.

Hamburgh, Febr. 22. From Capenhagen they write, That the Ambaffador of Sueden, who lately arrived there, had not yet obtained any answer in writing from the Commissioners appointed to treat with him; or any final Declaration, how his Majefty of Denmark intends to govern himfelf in the prefent Conjuncture ; and that his Excellency feemed to prepare for his return home There remain at prefent hardly any of the Suedifh Troops in the Ukkermark, being all removed into the kinder Pomeren, belonging to the Elector of Brandenburgh. They fill draw nearer to the Ducale Prusha, their principal Quarters being not above fix Leagues from the Frontiers of that Countrey, which makes it generally believed, that the Suedes will attack his Electoral Highness in his Territories in Prussia, as being out of the Empire. In the mean time we do not hear that they commit any Hoffilities, but that they live as well with the Countrey people, as can be expected ; and fome lay, that they are only removed out of the Ukkermark, into the hinder Pomeren, for the conveniency of their Quarters. Our Letters from Sueden continue to speak; as if that Crown would have a Fleet at Sea this Summer, and in order to it, preparations are even making on this fide of the water in the Maritime places in the Suediffi Pomeren.

Francfort, March 2. From Ratisbonne they write? that the Bishop of Bamberg in the Circle of Franconia, had made farther Complaints to the Dyet, concerning the Exactions of the Brandenburgh Troops, who are quartered within that Circle. And that the Bifhop of s trasburg had caufed a Memorial to be preferred to the Dyer, in which he justifies his Retreat out of the Empire, and the putting himfelf under the protection of valt provision the French make in Alfatia of all things the Most Christian King. It is hardly credible, what neceffary for the carrying on the War this Summer. was intended that the French Troops should have continued in their Quarters till the middle of April, to refresh them, after the fatigues of the last Campagne; but we are now told, that Monfieur de Turenne will return into Alfatia about the latter end of this month, and take the Field very early. From Vienna they write, that General Montecnculi prepares indeed for his departure towards the Imperial Army, but that he defites to have with him 600 000 Crowns for the defraying the Expences that neceffarily attend an Army. In Hungary 4000 Rebels are faid to be got together again, and to have given great distorbance to the Imperialists : and 3000 Turks, belonging to Buda, have lately appeared near Newhausel, with intention (as is thought ) to exact Contributions, Oc.

Cologne, March 5. The Sieur de Fario hath begun to execute this Diocels, on account of the monies pretended by the States General of our Blector, who had hoped that the Letter he had written to the States, would have at least defensed the faid excention, to the end the mat-

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fer might have been amicably accommodated by the interpolition of the Emperor and the King of Spain ; but on the contrary, yelterday the faid Sieur Fario fent out a party of 80 Horfe to feize the Abbé of Knefteden, The not meeting with him, fet fire to fome Barns and Out-houses belonging to him. There is at present great diffurence between the Clergy, and the Secular States of his Diodefs, on the Subject of their Priviledges. This morning the Prince of Lorrain, the Marquels de Grana, and other of the Imperial General Officers, are marched with feveral Regiments towards the Meuse, where we understand the Imperialis are in some danger of being fallen upon by the French. Yesterday arrived here the Marquels de Bourgamanero, on his journey to Vienna, Whither he goes on the part of the Duke de Villa Hermofa, Governor of the Spanish Metherlands ; he will call in at Bon, to confer with the Imperial Generals that are there, on the Subject of his Errand to the Emperor.

Bruffels, March 8. On Tuesday night laft, the Marquels d' Ancré, Governor of Aeth, came with 2000 Horfe as far as Hall, three Leagues from hence, not without giving a great Alarm to those Parts, which even reached this place, whither many Peafants fled with their Horfes and Goods ; the French having taken about 500 Horses, returned again. From Maestricht they write, That the Marefehal de Crequi is fuddenly expected there with a great Convoy; That the Troops he has with him, compole a very conliderable Body; which makes it feared, that when he has feen the faid Convoy fafe at Maestricht, he will fall upon the Imperialists in the Countrey of Liege, and endeavour to force them to quit the Quarters they have there ; which they appre-hending, have desired the Imperial Generality at Bon, to Reinforce them, with certain Troops, who (we hear) are on their march accordingly. We cannot but conclude, from the great forwardnels we understand the French preparations for the Campagne are everywhere in, that they will be in the Field, fooner than any of the Armies on this fide. The Duke de Villa Hermefs had indeed resolved to raife five new Regiments of Infantry, but as yer Commissions are given out onely for two. We are told, that the Prince of Orange will forthwith fend certain Regiments, to Reinforce several Garifons on our Frontiers, which seem to be in some danger of being suddenly attacked by the French. We have Letters from Maples of the 17 past, which fay, that the Duke de Vivonne paffed by fome days before, having with him nine Men of War, three Fireships, and two Victuallers, with a fair wind towards Messina.

Hague, March 8. The States General and their Confederates, have, at the inftance of His Majefty of Great Brhain by his Ambaffador here, finally refolved to accept of Nimeguen for the place of Congress, so that we hope a Treaty will be now fuddenly fet on foot again. The fifth inftant in the evening, the Prince of Orange returned hither, and the next morning was Complimented thereupon by all the Foreign Ministers, and other Perfons of Quality here ; yesterday his Highness went to divert himself at Honslaerdike, with intention to be back again this evening. On Tuesday next, the Sieur de'Klinenburgh, Ambassador Extraordinary from the Crown of Denmark, will make his publick Entry into this place. It is faid, that he comes, amongst other things, to treat about an augmentation of the Subsidies which this State and their Allies are to pay that King, by virtue of the Treaty of Alliance between them. The Suedifh Ambaffador, finding by the refolution palled in the Affemblies of the States General the 27 paft, concerning their not treating with him any longer as Mediator, that nothing remains for him to do farther here,

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prepares for his departure. By the laft Ordinary from Vienna, we have advice, That the Emperor's Aimy this next Campagne, will confist in 40 000 men effectually; and that all possible care will be taken to prevent the milcarriages and differences that hapned during the latt. The Prince of Orange will likewife have a confiderable Army in the Field, compos'd (as we are told) of 30 Regiments of Foot, belides Cavalry. It is reported, that at the defire of the Duke de Villa Hermofi, Governor General of the spanish Netherlands, feveral Regiments are ordered to march that way, to reinforce the Spanish Garifons which lie most exposed to the French, and which, it is feared, they have their eye upon. The Deputies of the respective Admiralties will meet here in a day or two, to confult about matters relating to the Equipage by Sea.

Paris, March 9. We have from feveral hands, advice of the arrival of Monfieur de Vivonne at Melfina with the thips under his Command, without the leaft oppolition from the Spanifh Heet, which (it is faid) was retired towards Naples. We age told, that Monfieur de Twenne will part hende again very fuddenfy, in order to the beginning the Campagne in Alfaria, and thole parts? and that on this fide, the first action of our Troops may be towards Laxemburgh, and the Countrey of Liege. Monfieur de Crequi is on his march with a great Convoy towards Malfricht; it is thought he will attempt fomething upon the Imperialifts, who are quartered in the Countrey of Liege. Our Troops, we hear are about quitting of Maleych, after having demolifhed it, and removed the Artillery that was there to Muffricht.
