He was then bled to five Ounces, the Blood flewing no Signs of Inflammation ; and about Three in the Afternoon, the Apothecary, who attended him, found more violent Symp-toms, fuch as increafed Heat, wheezing Cough; universal lantom, fuch as increased rear, where ing cough, Universal infe-guor, and fluttering Pulle, on which he immediately applied Blifters to the Back and Arms, and Dr. Baker, Phylician at Stamford, was fent for, who arrived about Eight o'Clock on Tuefday Night, and found the Fever very high, and the Cough violent.

On Wednefday Morning, the 5th, the Symptoms rather abated, a Clyfter was given him, and at Three in the Afternoon, (at which Time the Fever was very violent) three Ounces of Blood were taken from him, which fhewed no Marks of Inflammation. He bose this Bleeding fo very Ill, that it was with great Difficulty he was brought to himfelf; however, on his Recovery from the Faintings, he appeared relieved, and had a toler-able Night.

All Thursday Morning, the 6th, he continued eafy, but, Three o'Clock in the Afternoon, he was leized with great Dif-ficulty of Breathing, and feemed in the utmost Danger. About Three in the Afternoon, ai he feemed free from Fever, a Dole of Rhubarb was given him, and he remained tree from Diferder, except a gentle Cough.
