narvon, and from Ruthin to the faid Town of Mold.

An Act for repairing and widening the Roads leading from Spalding High Bridge through Littleworth, and by Frognall and over James Deeping Stone Bridge in the County of Lincoln, to Maxey Outgang in the County of Northampton, adjoining to the High Road there.

An AG to explain, amend and render more effestual an AG made in the last Seffion of Parliament for repairing and widening several Roads leading from a Gate called Poole Gate in the Town and County of Poole.

An Act for enlarging the Terms and Powers granted by two Acts of Parliament of the first and seventeenth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty for repairing and amenting several Roads leading to and from the Borcugh of Evesham in the County of Worcester, and for explaining and making more effectual the said Acts; and also for amending, widening and keeping in Repair several other Roads in the Counties of Worcester, Warwick and Gloucester.

An AET for enlarging the Times for the first Meetings of Commissioners or Trustees for putting in Execution certain AETs of this Session of Parliament.

An Act for enlarging the Times limited for executing and performing feveral Provisions, Powers and Directions in certain Acts of this Seffion of Parliament.

And to fix private Bills.

Camp before Prague, June 8. Last Thurs-day the two Bridges which had been carried away by the Floods in the River were repair'd, and the Communication between the two Armies is now open. On Friday Morning early one of the Fore Posts (a finall Redoute with 80 Men and three Pieces of Cannon) was furprized by a Party of Auftrian Grenadiers, fupported by 200 Pandours : They threw their Grenades into the Fort, put the Men into Confusion, and, before Affistance came, the Pandours carried away the Cannon; the Lofs of Men was inconfiderable, about 12 or 15 on each Side. Deferters fay that the Garrifon of Progue have been amufed with Signals being made from the Steeples for Count Daun's Army to advance, however he is at too great a Diftance to return any of them. Since last Friday to this prefent Time the Auffrians have attempted nothing, but our Men have been kept constantly alert, and the Guards in all the Out Forts have been reinforced ; another Precaution likewife has been made ufe of, viz. Chevaux de Frife have been placed on the Edge of the Foffé of those Redoutes, which will make any Attempt to furprize them more difficult. Befides the four former Batteries, in which there are both Mortars and Cannon, two new ones of Cannon only, have been raifed on the other | Marshal Daun's Army,

Side of the River. Till Monday last our Batteries played inceffantly, and kept the Town on Fire Night and Day in feveral Places. Since that Time the Fire of the Batteries has abated; but they still continue firing, especially in the Night, and there is hardly a Shot fired from the Town. The Out Guards of Pandours at every Gate, receive a Reward for each Deferter they take. Two Deferters, who came in laft Night, fay that even the Subaltern Officers have no Meat given them; and that two Days ago the Garrifon in Prague began to kill their Horfes, of which a certain Number is distributed daily among the Troops. Last Monday came an Account, that, upon a Motion made by the Prince of Bevern, Count Daun's Army had quitted a very ftrong Poft on the High Grounds near Kuttenberg, and encamped in the Plain, with the Right at Czillau, and the Left at Maleschaw: This Day we have Notice that they have left that Camp, and are retiring to Teutsch Brod, towards Moravia : That the Prince of Bevern has taken Poffession of Czaslau, where he found four Days Provision for his whole Corps; that he is following them in their Retreat, and had taken about 80 Prifoners, and killed 40 or 50 Men. Lieutenant Colonel Meyer continues his Operations with Success ; and though his original Force did not exceed 1200 Men, he has raifed a new Battalion of Deferters, which makes him about 2000 ftrong, and advanced within three Miles of Nurenberg, where the Senate immediately met, and, after two Days Deliberation, have fent a Deputation to the King of Pruffia, to defire a Neutrality. It is hoped that the whole Circle of Franconia will follow this Example, notwithstanding the Efforts made by the Margrave of Anfpach to the contrary.

Camp before Prague, June 12. Last Wed-nefday Night the Town was again fet on fire by the Battery on this Side the Moldau, and burnt violently all Night; the next Day they continued firing all Day from the fame Battery. The Deferters that come in from Prague, fay that it is now 10 Days fince they began to kill their Hotfes; that Forty are given daily to the Troops ; that Horfe-Flefh is fold at two Grafch, about four Pence, per Pound ; that they fill continue to brew, but the Price of Beer is confiderably raifed; that there is no Want of Flour. and that Reports are conftantly spread of the Approach of Count Daun's Army, and of the French. By our last Accounts the Prince of Bevern continues at Czaslau, and probably will not fir till he receives the Reinforcement from Silefia, which is faid to be in full March. and is confiderable. Count Daun remains at Teutsch-Brod towards the Frontiers of Moravia.
