The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council, of the Eighth of June last, For paying the respective Bounties therein mentioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and alfo to all Able-bodied Landmen, who fhould vo-

luntarily enter themselves in His Majesty's Royal Navy; and likewife for paying the Rewards to Perfons difcovering Seamen who fhould conceal themselves, is near expiring : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, should be continued to be paid for fome Time longer ; His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Land-man, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to fuch Seamen and Landmen refpectively, who shall, on or before the Thirteenth Day of August next, enter themselves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majesty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January last : And likewife, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Perfons who shall, on or before the faid Thirteenth Day of August next, discover any Seaman or Seamen who shall conceal themselves, so as such Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majefty's Service. Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

His Majefty having been pleafed to appoint his Grace Augustus Henry Duke of Graston, to be Lord Lieutenant of the County of Suffolk, his Grace this Day took the Oaths appointed to be taken thereupon, instead of the Oaths of Allegiance and Supremacy.

Warlaw, June 25. We have as yet no Ac-count of the Ruffians having left their Camp in the Neighbourhood of Kowno. Vienna, June 27. Yesterday Morning the

Emperor and Empress affisted at the Te Deum,

which was fung at the Cathedral of St. Stephen, for the Deliverance of Prague; and, in the Evening, their Imperial Majefties appeared at the French Comedy, with the three eldeft Archdukes, and the four eldest Archdutchesses. The Empress Queen has promoted M. Vettes, who brought the first News of the Victory, to the Rank of Colonel.

Copenhagen, July 2. The Swedifh Squadron, confifting of fix Men of War and two Frigats, is arrived here, and proposes speedily to join with that of Denmark, at Fleckery on the Coaft of Norway.

Cologne, July 7. The three States of this Electorate fent Yesterday a Deputation to wait on the Elector at Aix la Chapelle, and humbly to represent to his Electoral Highness the tyranical Manner in which the French treat his Subjects, and to fhew the Impoffibility of furnishing the 400 Waggons, with four Horfes each, which Marshal d'Estrées has demanded, to bring up Provisions to his Army. There begins to pass daily fome Boats with Wheat, Rye, Oats and Straw; they come four or five together without any Convoy; and this will continue for fome Time, as it is determined to furnish from Alface the Magazines at Wefel, and to make a large one here, that the Troops may not fuffer as they have done fince they enter'd into Weftphalia. Advices from the French Army fay, that the Empress had ordered two Regiments of Huffars to march to reinforce Marshal d'Estrées. M. Kinkel, the Imperial Commiffary, arrived the 3d at Leer in East Friesland, to concert with Marquis D'Auvet (who commands the French Troops in that Country) the Meafures to be taken upon the Submiffion of the Country. Last Tuesday the Volontaires de Flandres and Hainault arrived here, and this Morning they marched to Paderborn. We hourly expect two Battalions of Militia to pass; and the 17th two more, to remain in Garrison here.

Bruffels, July 8. According to our last Let-ters from Marshal d'Estrées's Army, the French are faid to be in full Poffeffion of the Principality of East Friesland, and all Communication cut off through Weftphalia between the Electorate of Hanover and the United Provinces. The last Advices we have here from Bohemia, are of the 26th of June, when the Auftrian Army was encamped at Kolodieg near Auwal, not far from the Spot where the Battle was fought on the 6th of May.
