PRESENT,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council,

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council, of the Eighth of July laft, For paying the respective Bounties therein menti-

cned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and alfo to all Able-bodied Landmen, who should voluntarily enter themfelves in His Majefty's Royal Navy; and likewife for paying the Rewards to Perfons difcovering Seamen who fhould conceal themselves, is near expiring : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, fhould be continued to be paid for fome Time longer ; His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to fuch Seamen and Landmen respectively, who shall, on or before the Twenty Third Day of September next, enter themfelves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majesty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January last : And likewife, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Perfons who shall, on or before the faid Twenty Third Day of September next, discover any Seaman or Seamen who shall conceal themfelves, fo as fuch Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majefty's Service. Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

Constantinople, July 1. The Ramazan has passed here with the utmost Tranquility, and Bairam fucceeded on the 19th paft; at which Time feveral Changes were made, as usual, in the fubordinate Offices of the Government. The one of the most Importance was that of the Captain Pascha, who is ordered to remain at a Village on the Afia Side of the Archipelago. He is fucceeded by Aly Pafcha, Beglerbeg of Rumelia, who is married to a Sultana, a Niece of the Sultan's ; and the Pascha of Tripoly in Syria is appointed Beglerbeg of Rumelia. There has not been any Fire-works exhibited to the People, nor any publick Treats among the Minifters. The Grand Seignor, who, on his Acceffion to the Throne, ordered Sumptuary Laws to be put in Execution, has renewed them about

about Drefs, and has prohibited the Subjects wearing Scarlet, or other lively coloured Clothes. The Sultan has given three Days Diversions to his Ladies, at a Seraglio on the fresh Water River.

Berlin, August 2. According to our last Letters from Pruffia, of the 28th paft, the Ruffians have not yet made any further Progress fince the taking of Memel; and though Marthal Apraxin approaches nearer the Frontiers of the Kingdom, he does not feem defirous to come The Garrison of Memel is to an Engagement.
