The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council, of the Eighth of July laft, For paying the respective Bounties therein menti-

oned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and alfo to all Able-bodied Landmen, who fhould voluntarily enter themfelves in His Majefty's Royal Navy; and likewife for paying the Rewards to Perfons discovering Seamen who should conceal themfelves, is near expiring : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, fhould be continued to be paid for fome Time longer ; His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to fuch Seamen and Landmen refpectively, who fhall, on or before the Twenty Third Day of September next, enter themfelves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majesty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January last : And likewife, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Perfons who fhall, on or before the faid Twenty Third Day of September

Drefden, Aug. 31. On the 28th the Army which the King of Pruffia brought out of Lufatia, came and encamped under the Walls of this Town, on the Right Side of the Elbe, near the Black and White Gates of the Town. His Majefty and Prince Henry lodged near the Black Gate, in a Houfe belonging to a Valet de Chambre of Count Bruhl, the Prime Ministers Yesterday Asternoon his Majesty, at the Head of his Van Guard, confifting of eight Squadrons and fix Batallions, paffed over the River, and through this Town, followed by Prince Henry at the Head of the Infantry. The Van Guard encamped Yesterday Evening behind the Ooster Weyde, on the left Side of the Elbe, from whence both the King and Prince Henry marched this Morning, at Four o'Clock, taking the Road towards Noffen. This Morning likewife the whole Army, which laid before the New Town, is marched, and are paffing through this Place, in order to encamp this Evening at the fame Place which the King left this Morning. Prince Maurice's Corps came Yesterday from Sedlitz, and encamped in the Evening behind the Great Garden, close by the Heights of Keffeldorff, in order to join the King's Army. The Duke of Bevern, General Winterfeld, and his Royal Highness Prince Ferdinand of Pruffia, remain in Lufatia with about 30000 Men, and are retired from Bernstadt to Gorlitz, in order to defend the Frontiers of Silefia on that Side: There is still a strong Prussian Garrison in Budiffin, to confume the Provisions remaining there j

there; after which it is to join the Prince of (Bevern's Army. Upon the King of Pruffia's quitting Lufatia, the Auftrian Army is retired back into Bohemia. It is however supposed, that General Nadasti's Corps will be detached to Silefia, in which Cafe the Army under the Prince of Bevern will also go thither, or, at leaft, a Part of it. Marshal Keith is in this Town, and goes away with the Army Tomorrow to join the King.

Turin, Aug. 31. M. Chauvelin, the French Ambaffador, returned here the 29th, after having accompanied the Infanta Dutchels of Parma to Pont Beauvoisin. Her Royal Highness has made very confiderable Prefents to all those who attended her. On the 21st of this Month the Court went into Mourning for the Death of the late Queen Dowager of Pruffia. Orders have been given that is fhould laft a Month.

Cologne, Sept. 2. The Emperor has fent a Refeript to each particular lilember of the Circle, enjoining them, under Pain of Execu-tion, to march their responsive Contingents immediately, without waiting one for the other.

Hague, Sept. 9. Letters from Drefden have brought an Account of the King of Prussia's having paffed through that Town with his Detachment on the 31ft paft, and that he is marching, directly by the great Poft Reads, to Erfurth, leaving Leipfick on the Right Hand.
