The Prussan Army returned to it's former Camp at Velau, where they still remain; as do the Enemy in their The Loss of the Prussians does not exceed 2000, killed and wounded, which Loss however was immediately esplaced by the disciplined Militia. The Loss of the Enemy must be near 14000. General Lapuchin was wounded and taken Prisoner, with a Colonel of the Russian Artillery, but the former is sent back on his Parole. The Prussian Army had, at first, made themselves Masters of above 80 Pieces of Cannon, but were afterwards obliged to abandon them with 11 of their own, for Want of Car-riages. The Prussians have lost no General or Officer of Distinction. Lieutenant General Count Dohna is the only one wounded. It is faid there are three Russian Generals killed.
