A T the Court at Kenfington, the 20th Day of September, 1757,

PRESENT,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council, of the Ninth of August last, For paying the respective Bounties therein mentioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and alfo to all Able-bodied Landmen, who fhould vo-Juntarily enter themselves in His Majefty's Royal Navy; and likewife for paying the Rewards to Perfons difcovering Seamen who should conceal themfelves, is near expiring : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, thould be continued to be paid for fome Time longer ; His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Land-man, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to fuch Seamen and Landmen refpectively, who shall, on or before the Fifteenth Day of November next, enter themselves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majefty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January laft : And likewife, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Perfons who fhall, on or before the faid Fifteenth Day of November next, discover any Seaman or Seamen who shall conceal themfelves, fo as fuch Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majesty's Service. Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

# Whitehall, October 15, 1757.

Copy of a Letter from Mr. Secretary Pitt to Sir Edward Hawke, and to Sir John Mordaunt, dated Whitehall, September 15, 1757, difpatched by the Viper Sloop, and received by them on board the Ramilies the 22d Day of September.

Sir, TISI

**TIS Majefty**, by His Secret Inffructions, dated the 5th Day of August last, having directed the Return of the Fleet under your Command, together with the Land Forces on board, " fo as to be in England at, or about, " as near as may be, the End of September, un-" lefs the Circumftances of the Ships and Forces, " fhall neceffarily require their Return fooner ;" I am now to fignify to you the King's Pleafure, that you do not confider the abovementioned Time, limited for your Return, as intended, in any Manner, to affect, or interfere with the full Execution of the first and principal Object of the Expedition; namely, "Attempting, as far as shall be found practicable, a Descent " on the French Coaft, at or near Rochefort, " in order to attack, if practicable, and, by a " vigorous Imprefion, force that Place, and to " burn and defiroy, to the utmost of your " Power, all Shipping, Docks, Magazines, and " Arfenals, that shall be found there, and exert " fuch other Efforts, as fhall be judged most proper for annoying the Enemy." And with Regard to any other particular At-tempt, which, agreeably to your Orders, you fhall have commenced, and in the Execution whereof you thall be actually engaged. It is also His Majesty's Pleasure, that you do not defist from, or break up the fame, merely and folely on Account of the Time, limited for your Return, by the Inffructions abovementioned; but that, notwithstanding the fame, you do conti-nue, with the Fleet, during such a farther Number of Days, as may afford a competent Time, for the Completion of any Operation under the above Circumstances ; After which you are to take Care to return, with the Fleet under your Command, and the Forces on board, in the Manner directed by your former Inftructions.

Berlin, October 4. According to the latt Letters from the King's Army, his Majefly, According to the laft after having waited in vain fifteen Days in the Neighbourhood of Erfurth for the Army of the Empire, and that of France, and not judging it proper to attack two Armies of fuch fuperior Force, in their Entrenchments, has marched towards Naumbourg, and, on the 2d Inftant, fixed his Head Quarters at Buttelstadt. The Ruffian Army still continues to file off by Tillit, towards the Frontiers. The Corps under the Command of General Fermor, had paffed the Memel on the 26th of September, and the reft the Columns were preparing to pais it four Bridges. All the reft of Pruffia of on four Bridges. is entirely evacuated. Our Army has still 12,000 Bushels of Meal at Cumbinnen. Acis entirely evacuated. cording to the Letters of the 30th of September, the Ruffians have entitely pafied the Memel. They abandoned Tillit the 27th, and our Army entered it on the 29th. The Fort of Penamunde in Pomerania furrendered to the Swedes on the 23d of September, after having defended itself for nine Days. The Garrison, defended itself for nine Days. The Garrison, confishing of 175 Men of the Militia, were made Prisoners of War. There has been a brick Cannonade between the two Armies in Silefia, on the 26th, near the Village of Parchwitz. Our Loss thereby amounts to 100 Men, that of the Enemy is confiderably more.
