A^T the Court at Kensington, the 20th Day of September, 1757,

PRESENT,

The KING's moft Excellent Majefty in Council.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council, of the Ninth of August last, For paying the respective Bounties therein mentioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and alfo to all Able-bodied Landmen, who fhould voluntarily enter themselves in His Majesty's Royal Navy; and likewife for paying the Rewards to Perfons difcovering Seamen who thould conceal themfelves, is near expiring : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, should be continued to be paid for fome Time longer; His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to fuch Seamen and Landmen refpec-sively, who shall, on or before the Fifteenth Day of November next, enter themselves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majefty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January last : And likewife, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Perfons who shall, on or before the faid Fifteenth Day of November next, discover any Seaman or Seamen who shall conceal themfelves, fo as fuch Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majefty's Service. Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

Rome, Sept. 24. One Hundred and Fortynine Moors, who were lately fold to the Order of Malta, were embarked a few Days ago at Civita Vecchia for that Ifland. On the 19th Inftant, circular Intimations were given for the Confiftory, which the Pope has fixed for the 26th Inftant; in order to difpatch many Ecclefiafficial Affairs, that have been fulpended on Account of his Illnefs.

Florence, Oct. 1. On the 23d a Battallion of the First Tuscan Regiment arrived here from Leghorn, to reinforce this Garrison. On the 24th anchored at Leghorne from Caglieri, his Britannick Majesty's Ships the Guernsey and Lyme, convoying from thence four French Prizes, viz. two from the Levant, (one of which, from Alexandretta; is faid to be worth about 250001.) and two from Marseiles, which Admiral Osborn's Squadron took; a few Weeks ago, near the Island of Sardinia.

Hague, Off. 21. We know little of the Operations of the Armies, which still keep the Field. The Accounts we have, are, that the French make no Progress, and seem very eager to get into Winter Quarters, if the King of Pruffia will let them ; but that that Prince had made fome Motions within these few Days, in order to furprize the Prince of Soubize, in which he was very near fucceeding, having got to Er-furth again. In Silelia, the Auftrians, who are advanced near Breflau, pretend that they will attack the Prince of Bevern between the Oder and the Lob; but there is a Report as if they had been repulfed, which gains the more Credit, as the laft Accounts from Vienna and Bruffela are very dry upon the Subject. It feems agreed on all Sides, that if Prince Charles does not fucceed in forcing the Prince of Bevern to abandon the Capital of Silefia, they, on their Side, will be under a Necessity of abandoning the Province for Warit of Subliftence.
