PRESENT.

The KING's most Excellent Majefty in Council.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council, of the Twentieth of September laft, For paying the respective Bounties therein mentioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and alfo to all Able-bodied Landmen, who fhould voluntarily enter themfelves in His Majefty's Royal Navy; and likewife for paying the Rewards to Perfons difcovering Seamen who should conceal themfelves, will expire upon the Fifteenth Day of this Inftant November : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, fhould be continued to be paid for fome Time longer; His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Land-man, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to fuch Seamen and Landmen respectively, who shall, on or before the Fourteenth Day of January next, enter themfelves in the Roval Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majefty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January last : And likewife, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Perfons who fhall, on or before the faid Fourteenth Day of January next, difcover any Seaman or Seamen who fhall conceal themfelves, fo as fuch Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majesty's Service. Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

that he again applies himfelf to Bufinefs. Turin, Nov. 2. The Prince and Princefs of Galliczin arrived here on Sunday laft : They are come to make the Tour of Italy, and pro-

pole returning by Vienna to Molcovy. Florence, Nov. 5. On the 29th paft, in the Afternoon, Marshal Botta arrived here from Pavia, with a very numerous Retinue. Next Morning the Foreign Ministers, all the different Corps of the Military Officers, and the Nobility of the Country, went to compliment him on his Arrival. On the 31ft he affembled an Ex-traordinary Council of the Regency, and took Possefion of this Government. The Emperor has appointed the Marquis Del to be Governor of Leghorn ; from whence we have received Advice, that, on the 29th paft, his Britan-nick Majeffy's Ship the Lyme brought into that Port two French Prizes, loaden with Goods from the Coaft of Barbary, bound for Marfeilles.

who, during this prefent War with France, hath or have committed, or shall commit, any such Act or Acts of Piracy or Robbery as aforefaid, either on board any Neutral Ship or Ships, or any other Ship or Ships belonging to His Majefty's Subjects, fo as fuch Offender or Offenders shall be apprehended and duly convicted thereof; which Reward, with Re-fpect to the Conviction of fuch Offender of Offenders of any Act or Act of Piracy or Robbery, committed on board any one fuch Neutral or other Ship as aforefaid, shall be paid by Samuel Seddon, Efq; Sollicitor of the Admiralty, immediately after fuch respective Conviction.

And as a further Encouragement for the apprehending and profecuting of the faid Offender or Offenders, their Lordships do also hereby promife, that every Perfon who shall be intitled to the Whole, or any Part of fuch Reward of One Hundred Pounds as aforefaid, shall also, upon Request, have a Protection from being impressed into His Majesty's Sea Service, for the Space of one Year from the Date of fuch Protection.

Cuftom-Houfe, London, November 18, 1757. Whereas on Tuesday the 8th Instant, in the Night, John Miles and William Dodd, Officers of the Customs, belonging to the Port of Arundell in Suffex, with four Dragoons, fell in with a large Gang of Smuglers, to the Number of Fifty or upwards, who were loading a great Number of Horses with Tea, and upon the Officers attempting to feize the fame, a Signal was given by the Smuglers to a Cutter lying near the Shore, belonging to Selfey near Chichefter, commanded by one Thomas Green, as reprefented by the Account transmitted to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Custom's, from which Cutter the faid Tea was brought and landed, as there is great Reason to believe; And whereas thereupon a great Quantity of Fire Arms and other offensive Weapons were brought from the Cutter to the Smuglers on the Shore with which they (the Smuglers) fired upon the Officers and Dragoons, and fhot one Thomas Cole, a Dragoon of the Inifkilling Regiment, commanded by the Honouraile Lieutenant General Cholmondley, who is fince dead, and alfo dangeroufly wounded another Dragoon, and violently heat and abufed one of the Officers of the Cuftoms, and refcued from the Officers much the greatest Part of the faid Ica. The Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, in order to bring the Officers to Justice, and the more effectually to put a Stop to fuch illegal, violent, and outragious Proceedings, do bereby promife a Reward of One Hundred Pounds to any Perfon or Perfons who shall apprehend the faid Offenders, or any or either of them, fo that they may be dealt with according to Law, to be paid by the Receiver General of His Majelty's Cultoms, on Conviction of each of the faid Offenders.
