AT the Court at *St. James's*, the 9th Day of November, 1757,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council, of the Twentieth of September last, For paying the respective Bounties therein mentioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and also to all Able-bodied Landmen, who should voluntarily enter themselves in His Majesty's Royal Navy; and likewise for paying the Rewards to Persons discovering Seamen who should conceal themselves, will expire upon the Fifteenth Day of this Instant November: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, should be continued to be paid for some Time longer; His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to such Seamen and Landmen respectively, who shall, on or before the Fourteenth Day of January next, enter themselves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majesty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January last: And likewise, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Persons who shall, on or before the said Fourteenth Day of January next, discover any Seaman or Seamen who shall conceal themselves, so as such Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majesty's Service. Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

*Rome, Oct. 29.* The Pope is so well recovered from the last severe Attack of his Disorder, that he again applies himself to Business.

*Turin, Nov. 2.* The Prince and Princess of Galliczin arrived here on Sunday last: They are come to make the Tour of Italy, and propose returning by Vienna to Moscow.

*Florence, Nov. 5.* On the 29th past, in the Afternoon, Marshal Botta arrived here from Pavia, with a very numerous Retinue. Next Morning the Foreign Ministers, all the different Corps of the Military Officers, and the Nobility of the Country, went to compliment him on his Arrival. On the 31st he assembled an Extraordinary Council of the Regency, and took Possession of this Government. The Emperor has appointed the Marquis Del to be Governor of Leghorn; from whence we have received Advice, that, on the 29th past, his Britannick Majesty's Ship the *Lymie* brought into that Port two French Prizes, loaden with Goods from the Coast of Barbary, bound for Marseilles.

My Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty having been credibly informed that divers evil-minded Persons have of late (under Colour of Commissions granted by their Lordships, during this present War, to the Commanders of Privateers) frequently committed Acts of Piracy and other Outrages, by unlawfully plundering and forcibly taking away Goods, Effects, Stores and Ammunition, as well on board of Neutral Ships, as on board of other Ships belonging to His Majesty's Subjects, in Violation of the Laws of Nations, and of the particular Laws of this Kingdom; Their Lordships therefore, in order to detect and bring such Offenders to Justice, are pleased to promise a Reward of One Hundred Pounds, without any Deduction, unto or amongst such Person or Persons, as shall discover any other Person or Persons belonging to any British Privateer, or other British Vessel, who,
