who, during this prefent War with France, hath or have committed, or shall commit, any such Act or Acts of Piracy or Robbery as aforefaid, either on board any Neutral Ship or Ships, or any other Ship or Ships belonging to His Majefty's Subjects, fo as fuch Offender or Offenders shall be apprehended and duly convicted thereof; which Reward, with Re-fpect to the Conviction of fuch Offender of Offenders of any Act or Act of Piracy or Robbery, committed on board any one fuch Neutral or other Ship as aforefaid, shall be paid by Samuel Seddon, Efq; Sollicitor of the Admiralty, immediately after fuch respective Conviction.

And as a further Encouragement for the apprehending and profecuting of the faid Offender or Offenders, their Lordships do also hereby promife, that every Perfon who shall be intitled to the Whole, or any Part of fuch Reward of One Hundred Pounds as aforefaid, shall also, upon Request, have a Protection from being impressed into His Majesty's Sea Service, for the Space of one Year from the Date of fuch Protection.

Whereas on Tuesday the 8th Instant, in the Night, John Miles and William Dodd, Officers of the Customs, belonging to the Port of Arundell in Suffex, with four Dragoons, fell in with a large Gang of Smuglers, to the Number of Fifty or upwards, who were loading a great Number of Horfes with Tea, and upon the Officers attempting to feize the fame, a Signal was given by the Smuglers to a Cutter lying near the Shore, belonging to Selfey near Chichefter, commanded by one Thomas Green, as reprefented by the Account transmitted to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Custom's, from which Cutter the faid Tea was brought and landed, as there is great Reason to believe; And whereas thereupon a great Quantity of Fire Arms and other offensive Weapons were brought from the Cutter to the Smuglers on the Shore, with which they (the Smuglers) fired upon the Officers and Dragoons, and fhot one Thomas Cole, a Dragoon of the Inifilling Regiment, commanded by the Honouraile Lieutenant General Cholmondley, who is fince dead, and alfo dangeroufly wounded another Dragoon, and violently heat and abused one of the Officers of the Cuftoms, and refcued from the Officers much the greatest Part of the faid Ica. The Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, in order to bring the Offienders to Justice, and the more effectually to put a Stop to such illegal, wielent, and outragious Proceedings, do hereby promise a Reward of One Hundred Pounds to any Perfon or Perfons who shall apprehend the faid Offenders, or any or either of them, fo that they may be dealt with according to Law, to be paid by the Receiver General of His Majesty's Customs, on Conviction of each of the

faid Offenders. And any of the Perfons who were concerned in the Refcue of the Goods aforefaid, who shall, within three Months after fuch Offence, difcover two or more of their Accomplices, fo as they be convicted thereof, will be intitled to a Reward of Fifty Pounds; and every fuch Perfon fo difcovering, will be clearly acquitted and difcharged of bis Offence aforefaid, by the Act of the of the of this target the 9th of His prefent Majefty.
