Dragoon of the Iniskilling Regiment, commanded by the Honourable Lieutenant General Cholmondley, who is fince dead, and also dangerously wounded another Dra-geon, and violently beat and abused one of the Officers of the Customs, and refcued from the Officers much the greatest Part of the said Tea.
