**M**Y Mate, Grove Gilles, was seized with a violent Fever, in my Passage from London to Virginia, and was delirious, and, as I thought, very dangerous. I gave him Half a Paper of Dr. James's Fever Powder, which I had at Mr. Newbery's, the Bible and Sun in St. Paul's Church Yard; it operated by Stool and vomiting.
