The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council, of the Ninth of November laft, For paying the respective Bounties therein mentioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and also to all Able-bodied Landmen, who should voluntarily enter themfelves in His Majefty's Royal Navy ; and likewife for paying the Rewards to Perfons discovering Seamen who should conceal themfelves, will expire upon the Fourteenth Day of this Instant January: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, fhould be continued to be paid for fome Time longer ; His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Land. man, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to fuch Seamen and Landmen refpectively, who shall, on or before the Twenty-eighth Day of February next, enter themfelves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majefty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January 1757: And likewife, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Perfons who shall, on or before the faid Twenty-eighth Day of February next, discover any Seaman or Seamen who shall conceal themfelves, fo as fuch Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majesty's Service. Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

And Whereas the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treafury have received Information, That a Loan of Money for that Purpole is at this Time negociating in this Kingdom; Their Lordships do hereby promise a Reward of Two Hundred Pounds to any Perfon, by whole Difcovery any Subject of His Majefty, or any Perfon reliding within this Realm, fhall be convicted of lending or advancing directly or indirectly, or of caufing or procuring to be to lent or advanced, or of fubfcribing for, or contributing to, or of folliciting or contracting for or remitting, either in Coin or Bullion, or by Bill or Bills of Exchange, or by any other Means whatfoever, any Sum or Sums of Money, to or for the Use or Purpose aforesaid. The faid Reward to be paid immediately on the Conviction of every fuch Offender, by the Solicitor of the Treasury, without Deduction, their Lordships having given Directions for the immediate Profecution of fuch Offenders.
