The KING's most Excellent Majefty in Council.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council, of the Thirteenth of January laft, For paying the respective Bounties there-

in mentioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and also to all Able-bodied Landmen, who should voluntarily enter themfelves in His Majesty's Royal Navy; and likewife for paying the Rewards to Perfons discovering Seamen who should conceal themfelves, will expire upon the Twenty Eighth Day of this Inftant February : And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, should be continued to be paid for fome Time longer ; His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to fuch Seamen and Landmen refpectively, who fhall, on or before the Tenth Day of April next, enter themfelves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majefty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January 1757 : And likewife, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Perfons who fhall, on or before the faid Tenth Day of April next, discover any Seaman or Seamen who shall conceal themfelves, fo as fuch Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majesty's Service. Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.
