of September laft, for prohibiting the Exporting out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the Twenty Ninth Day of April next-And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some longer Time-His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, Require, Prohibit, and Command, That no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever, (except the Ma-ster General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Twenty Ninth Day of April next, prefume to tranf-port into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwile, any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or thip, or lade, any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Vessel, in order to Transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or Carrying the same Coastwise, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Pe-nalties inflicted by an Act passed in the Twenty Ninth Year of His Majesty's Reign, entituled, se An Act to impower His Majesty to prohibit 66 the Exportation of Salt Petre, and to inforce <sup>60</sup> the Law for impowering His Majesty to pro-<sup>65</sup> hibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any <sup>66</sup> Sort of Arms and Ammunition; And alfo to <sup>66</sup> impower His Majesty to restrain the Carrying <sup>66</sup> Coastwife of Saltpetre, Gunpowder, or any "Sort of Arms or Ammunition."-And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Mafter Gene-ral of the Ordnance, and His Majefty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
