PRESENT,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council, of the Twenty Fourth of February laft, For paying the refpec-

tive Bounties therein mentioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and also to all Able-bodied Landmen, who fhould voluntarily enter themfelves in His Majefty's Royal Navy; and likewife for paying the Rewards to Perfons difcovering Seamen who should conceal themfelves, will expire upon the Tenth Day of April next : - And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, fhould be continued to be paid for fome Time longer ; His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to fuch Seamen and Landmen refpectively, who shall, on or before the Twentieth Day of May next, enter themfelves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majefty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January 1757 : And likewife, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Perfons who shall, on or before the faid Twentieth Day of May next, difcover any Seaman or Seamen who fhall conceal themfelves, fo as fuch Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majeffy's Service. Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council of the Twentieth

of September laft, for prohibiting the Exporting out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder, Salt Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the Twenty Ninth Day of April next-And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the faid Prohibition should be continued for some longer Time-His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, Require, Prohibit, and Command, That no Perfon or Perfons whatfoever, (except the Mafter General of the Ordnance for His Majefty's Service) do, at any Time during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Twenty Ninth Day of April next, prefume to tranf-port into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwile, any Gunpowder, Salipetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or thip, or lade, any Gunpowder, Saltpetre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on Board any Ship or Vessel, in order to Transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or Carrying the fame Coaftwife, without Leave or Permiffion in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forseitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the Twenty Ninth Year of His Majefty's Reign, entituled, An Act to impower His Majefty to prohibit the Exportation of Salt Petre, and to inforce the Law for impowering His Majefty to pro-hibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or any 66 ٤٢ Sort of Arms and Ammunition; And also to 66 impower His Majefty to reftrain the Carrying ۶۵ Coaftwise of Saltpetre, Gunpowder, or any "Sort of Arms or Ammunition."-And the Lords Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Commiffioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, and His Majefty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

Hague, April 4. Letters from Hanover of the 31ft paft, mention, That Advice had been received there by a Chaffeur, difpatched from Prince Ferdinand's Head Quarters, that a Corps of Huffars of the Allied Army had attacked the Rear Guard of the French in the Neighbourhood of Soeft, in the County of Marck, and taken, befides a confiderable Number of Prifoners, 10 Pieces of Cannon of 24 Pounds, and 5

of 6 Pounds, together with a large Magazine. They mention from Diepholtz the 31ft paft, that a Corps of Hanoverian Chaffeurs and Huffars had attacked, on the 26th, near Gelhausen, in the County of Bentheim, the Auftrian Regiments of Platz and Charles Lorraine, and cut to Pieces 20 of them, made many Prifoners, and taken 12 Baggage Waggons.

Extract of a Letter from Ruremonde, April 4. Yefterday Morning arrived here the Duke de Chevreuse, to command 16 Squadrons and eight Battalions which are to be quartered here, and in the Neighbouring Villages.

The Head Quarters of the Prince of Clermont are still at Wesel, but it is faid that he is upon the Point of removing to Nuyls or Duffeldorf. It is impoffible to conceive the Diforder which reigns through the French Army.

The Country of Juliers is filled more and more with their Baggage and Troops. Provifions here are exceffively dear, and we are in a Situation that is likely to become very diftressful.

Extract of a Letter from Admiral Ofborn to Mr. Clevland, Secretary of the Admiralty, dated on Board His Majesty's Ship Prince,

at Sea, March 12, 1758. On the 28th of last Month, between Cape De Gatt and Carthagena, I fell in with M. De Queine in the Foudroyant of 80, the Orpheus of 64, the Oriflame of 50, and the Pleiade of 24 Guns, which was the four Ships fent from Toulon to reinforce M. De Clue at Carthagena. On their feeing my Squadron, they immediately dispersed, and seered different Courfes; on which I detached Ships after each of them, whilft with the Body of my Squadron I flood off the Bay of Carthagena, to watch their Squadron there ; and about Seven in the Evening, Capt. Storr in the Revenge of 64, fupported by Capt. Hughes in the Berwick of 64, and Capt. Evans in the Preston of 50. Guns, took the Orpheus, commanded by M. de Herville, with 502 Men. Capt. Gardiner in the Monmouth of 64, fupported by Capt. Stan-hope in the Swiftfure of 70, and Capt. Hervey in the Hampton Court of 64 Guns, about One in the Morning, took the Foudroyant, on Board which was the Marquis de Quesne, Chief d'Escadre, with 800 Men. Captain Rowley in the Montague of 60, and Captain Montagu in the Monarch of 74 Guns, run the Oriflame a Shore, under the Caftle of Aiglos; and had it not been for Violating the Neutrality of the Coast of Spain, they would have entirely destroyed her. The Pleiade, of 24 Guns, got away by meer out-failing our Ships.

In this Action we have had the great Miffortune to lofe Captain Gardiner, and Captain Storr has loft the Calf of one of his Legs. And on this Occasion I should do the Officers and Seamen great Injuffice, if I did not mention to their Lordships their very alert, gallant and brave Behaviour : And I must, in a very particular Manner, recommend Lieutenant Carkett of the Monmouth, for his Bravery, after his Captain's Death, in engaging and difabling the Fou-

droyant in fuch a Manner, as to oblige her to strike as foon as the other Ships came up; and whom I propose to give the Command of the Foudroyant to, as a Reward for his Conduct.

The faid Reward to be paid immediately on the Conviction of every fuch Offender, by the Solicitor of the Treasury, without Deduction, their Lordships having given Directions for the immediate Profecution of fuch Offenders.

Whitehall, April 8, 1758.
