The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS Information hath been this Day given to His Majefty at this Board, that the English Privateers, cruizing in the Mediterranean,

visit many Neutral Ships bound from the Levant, and Smyrna, where the Plague now rages; And it being of the utmost Importance to prevent the Infection being brought into this Kingdom by any of the faid Privateers, - His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, Require, and Command, that all Privateers, and all Perfons, Goods, and Merchandizes, on Board the fame, now arrived, or that shall hereafter arrive, in any Port of this Kingdom, or of the Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from the Mediterranean, do make their Quarantine for Forty Days, and do likewife strictly conform themfelves, in all Respects, to the Rules and Regulations required to be observed by Ships and Veffels coming from Smyrna, and other Parts of the Levant, and the Coaft of Barbary. -And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for Executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Mafter General of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors, or Commanders in Chief, for the Time being, of the faid respective Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necesfary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

'HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council, of the Twenty Ninth of March last, For paying the respective Bounties therein mentioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and also to all Ablebodied Landmen, who should voluntarily enter themfelves in His Majefty's Royal Navy; and likewife for paying the Rewards to Perfons difcovering Seamen who fhould conceal themselves, will expire upon the Twentieth Day of this Instant May ;- And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, should be continued

AT the Court at Kenfington, the 2d Day of to be paid for fome Time longer ; His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to fuch Seamen and Landmen refpectively, who shall, on or before the Thirtieth Day of June next, enter themfelves' in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majefty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January 1757: And likewife, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Perfons who shall, on or before the faid Thirtieth Day of June next, discover any Seaman or Seamen who shall conceal themfelves, fo as fuch Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majesty's Service. Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.
