Whitehall, June 17.

**L**ATE on Thursday Night arrived Captain Fraine of the Speedwell Sloop, with Letters from the Duke of Marlborough, dated at Cancalle the 12th Instant, giving an Account, that the Troops, under his Grace's Command, had burnt many of the Naval Stores, one Man of War of 50 Guns, one of 36, all the Privateers, some of 30, several of 20 and 18 Guns, and, in the Whole, upwards of 100 Ships, notwithstanding they were under the Cannon of St. Malo's; but finding it impracticable to attack that Place, and receiving Intelligence of Troops being on their March from all Sides, his Grace thought it necessary to march back to Cancalle. Commodore Howe had made so good a Disposition of the Boats and Transports, that four Brigades, and ten Companies of Grenadiers, were re-embarked in less than seven Hours, the Enemy not having attempted to attack them; and, on the 12th, all the Troops were on board, waiting to take Advantage of the first Wind, to pursue the farther Objects of His Majesty's Instructions.

**W**HEREAS several Petitions have been presented to this Board, by sundry Merchants and others, setting forth, amongst other Things, That the Ships Conqueror, Fanny, Constant, Joanes, Benjamin, and Europa, laden with Silks, Oyls, and other Sorts of Goods, are lately arrived in this Kingdom, from several Ports in the Mediterranean, but having Letters of Marque on Board, the said Ships have been ordered to perform a Quarantine in like Manner with Privateers coming from the Mediterranean—Which Petitions being this Day taken into Consideration—It is thereupon Ordered in Council, that in Case it shall appear to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, that the aforementioned Ships have not touched at any infected Place, or had Communication with any Ship coming from the Levant, the Morea, or the Coast of Barbary, during their Voyage, and that the Crews are all in perfect Health, that then the said Ships Conqueror, Fanny, Constant, Joanes, Benjamin, and Europa, be discharged from any further Restraint on Account of Quarantine, and permitted to deliver their Cargoes—And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

**W**HEREAS adhering to the King's Enemies, by giving to them Aid or Comfort, either within his Realm, or elsewhere, is High Treason, and the Concealment thereof is Misprision of Treason;

And Whereas the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have received Information, That a Loan of Money for that Purpose is at this Time negotiating in this Kingdom; Their Lordships do hereby promise a Reward of Two Hundred Pounds to any Person, by whose Discovery any Subject of His Majesty, or any Person residing within this Realm, shall be convicted of lending or advancing directly or indirectly, or of causing or procuring to be so lent or advanced, or of subscribing for, or contributing to, or of soliciting or contracting for or remitting, either in Coin or Bullion, or by Bill or Bills of Exchange, or by any other Means whatsoever, any Sum or Sums of Money, to or for the Use or Purpose aforesaid. The said Reward to be paid immediately on the Conviction of every such Offender, by the Solicitor of the Treasury, without Deduction, their Lordships having given Directions for the immediate Prosecution of such Offenders.
