From Tuelday June 13, to Saturday June 17, 1758. Whiteball, June 17.

ATE on Thursday Night arrived Captain Fraine of the Speedwell Sloop, with Letters from the Duke of Marlborough, dated at Cancalle the 12th Instant, giving an Account, that the Troops, under his Grace's Command, had burnt many of the Naval Stores, one Man of War of 50 Guns, one of 36, all the Privateers, fome of 30, feveral of 20 and 18 Guns, and, in the Whole, upwards of 100 Ships, notwith finding they were under the Cannon of St. Malo's; but finding it impracticable to attack that Place, and receiving Intelligence of Troops being on their March from all Sides, his Grace thought it neceffary to march back to Cancalle. Commodore Howe had made fo good a Disposition of the Boats and Transports, that four Brigades, and ten Companies of Grenadiers, were reembarked in less than seven Hours, the Enemy not having attempted to attack them; and, on the 12th, all the Troops were on board, waiting to take Advantage of the first Wind, to purfue the farther Objects of His Majefty's Instructions.

HEREAS feveral Petitions have been presented to this Board, by fundry Merchants and others, fetting forth, amongft other Things, That the Ships Conqueror, Fanny, Conftant, Joanes, Benjamin, and Europa, laden with Silks, Oyls, and other Sorts of Goods, are lately arrived in this Kingdom, from feveral Ports in the Mediterranean, but having Letters of Marque on Board, the faid Ships have been ordered to perform a Quarantine in like Manner with Privateers coming.from the Mediterranean-Which Petitions being this Day taken into Confideration — It is thereupon Ordered in Council, that in Cafe it fliall appear to the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Cuftoms, that the aforementioned Ships have not touched at any infected Place, or had Communication with any Ship coming from the Levant, the Morea, or the Coalt of Barbary, during their Voyage, and that the Crews are all in perfect Health, that then the faid Ships Conqueror, Fanny, Constant, Joanes, Benjamin, and Europa, be discharged from any further Restraint on Account of Quarantine, and permitted to deliver their Cargoes-And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treafury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admitalty, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain. And Whereas the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury have received Information, That a Loan of Money for that Purpofe. is at this Time negociating in this Kingdom; Their Lordships do hereby promise a Reward of Two Hundred Pounds to any Perfon, by whole Difcovery any Subject of His Majefty, or any Person reliding within this Realm, shall be convicted of lending or advancing directly or indirectly, or of caufing or procuring to be fo lent or advanced, or of fubscribing for, or contributing to, or of folliciting or contracting for or remitting, either in Coin or Bullion, or by Bill or Bills of Exchange, or by any other Means whatloever, any Sum or Sums of Money, to or for the Ufe or Purpole aforefaid. The faid Reward to be paid immediately on the Conviction of every fuch Offender, by the Solicitor of the Treasury, without Deduction, their Lordships having given Directions for the immediate Profecution of fuch Offenders.
