AST Thursday Night an Express arrived from his Grace the Duke of Marlborough, with Letters dated in Cancalle Bay the 19th Inftant, giving an Account, That the Ships and Troops were ftill detained in that Bay by contrary Winds.

AT the Court at Kenfington, the 8th Day of May 1758,

PRESENT,

The KING's most Excellent Majefty in Council.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Coun-cil, of the Twenty Ninth of March laft, For paying the respective Bounties therein mentioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and alfo to all Ablebodied Landmen, who fhould voluntarily enter themfelves in His Majefty's Royal Navy; and likewife for paying the Rewards to Perfons difcovering Seamen who should conceal themselves, will expire upon the Twentieth Day of this Infant May ;- And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, should be continued to be paid for some Time longer ; His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to fuch Seamen and Landmen respectively, who shall, on or before the Thirtieth Day of June next, enter themfelves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majefty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January 1757 : And likewife, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Perfons who shall, on or before the faid Thirtieth Day of June next, discover any Seaman or Seamen who shall conceal themfelves, fo as fuch Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majefty's Service. Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

His Majefty's Treasury have received Information, That a Loan of Money for that Purpofe is at this Time negociating in this Kingdom; Their Lordships do hereby promise a Reward of Two Hundred Pounds to any Person, by whose Discovery any Subject of His Majesty, or any Perfon refiding within this Realm, shall be convicted of lending or advancing directly or indirectly, or of caufing or procuring to be fo lent or advanced, or of fubfcribing for, or contributing to, or of folliciting or contracting for or remitting, either in Coin or Bullion, or by Bill or Bills of Exchange, or by any other Means whatfoever, any Sum or Sums of Money, to or for the Ufe or Purpose aforefaid. The faid Reward to be paid immediately on the Conviction of every fuch Offender, by the Solicitor of the Treasury, without Deduction, their Lordships having given Directions for the immediate Profecution of fuch Offenders.

General Post Office, May 5, 1758.
