The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

> HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Coun-cil, of the Eighth of May laft, For paying the refpective Boun-

ties therein mentioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and also to all Able-bodied Landmen, who should voluntarily enter themfelves in His Majesty's Royal Navy; and likewife for paying the Rewards to Perfons difco-vering Seamen who should conceal themselves, is near expiring; And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, should be conti-nued to be paid for some Time longer ; - His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to fuch Seamen and Landmen respectively, who shall, on or before the Twelsth Day of August next, enter themselves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majefty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January 1757 : And likewife, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Perfons who fnall, on or before the faid Twelfth Day of August next, discover any Seaman or Seamen who shall conceal themfelves, fo as fuch Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majefty's Service. Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.
