AT the Court at *Kensington*, the 29th Day of June 1758,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council, of the Eighth of May last, For paying the respective Bounties therein mentioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and also to all Able-bodied Landmen, who should voluntarily enter themselves in His Majesty's Royal Navy; and likewise for paying the Rewards to Persons discovering Seamen who should conceal themselves, is near expiring; And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, should be continued to be paid for some Time longer; — His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to such Seamen and Landmen respectively, who shall, on or before the Twelfth Day of August next, enter themselves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majesty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January 1757: And likewise, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Persons who shall, on or before the said Twelfth Day of August next, discover any Seaman or Seamen who shall conceal themselves, so as such Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majesty's Service. Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

WHEREAS adhering to the King's Enemies, by giving to them Aid or Comfort, either within his Realm, or elsewhere, is High Treason, and the Concealment thereof is Misprision of Treason;

And Whereas the Lords Commissioners of

His Majesty's Treasury have received Information, That a Loan of Money for that Purpose is at this Time negotiating in this Kingdom; Their Lordships do hereby promise a Reward of Two Hundred Pounds to any Person, by whose Discovery any Subject of His Majesty, or any Person residing within this Realm, shall be convicted of lending or advancing directly or indirectly, or of causing or procuring to be so lent or advanced, or of subscribing for, or contributing to, or of soliciting or contracting for or remitting, either in Coin or Bullion, or by Bill or Bills of Exchange, or by any other Means whatsoever, any Sum or Sums of Money, to or for the Use or Purpose aforesaid. The said Reward to be paid immediately on the Conviction of every such Offender, by the Solicitor of the Treasury, without Deduction, their Lordships having given Directions for the immediate Prosecution of such Offenders.

THE Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give Notice, that they are ready to receive Proposals from any Person or Persons willing to supply the following Sorts and Quantities of Provisions for Four Hundred Men, viz. For each Man by the Week, seven Pounds Weight of Biscuit or soft Bread, two Pound and Half of Beef, one Pound of Pork, four Pints of Pease, three Pints of Oatmeal, six Ounces of Butter, eight Ounces of Cheese, or four Ounces of Butter in Lieu thereof; (being the Allowance to the Garrison of Gibraltar) and likewise such Quantities of Rum, Brandy, or Vidonia Wine as shall be judged necessary; which Provisions and Liquors are to be delivered within three Calendar Months from the Date of the Contract, at the Fort or Forts lately taken from the French on the River Senegal in Africa, for the Use of His Majesty's Troops which shall be put into Garrison there. The Lords will also be ready to receive Proposals for remitting the Pay of the said Troops in Spanish Silver. Proper Security must be given for the Performance of the Contract; and the said Proposals are to be delivered, sealed up and directed to their Lordships Secretaries at the said Treasury Chambers, at any Time on or before the 12th Day of July next.

In Pursuance of an Act of the last Session of Parliament relating to the Militia Forces in that Part of Great Britain called England, His Majesty's Lieutenant of the County of Middlesex doth hereby summon all Persons, qualified according to the Directions of the said Act, and of a former Act passed in the Thirtieth Year of His Majesty's Reign, to serve as Officers in the Militia of the said County of Middlesex, and willing to accept Commissions therein, to meet at Mr. Lambe's in Pall-Mall, on Thursday the 27th Day of July, in order that every Person so qualified, and willing to accept any such Commission, may, at such Meeting, deliver his Name in Writing, or cause it to be delivered, to His Majesty's said Lieutenant, or in Case of his Absence, to such Person as shall be authorized by such Lieutenant to receive the same, specifying also the Rank in which he is willing to serve.
