AT the Court at Kensington, the 29th Day of June 1758,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council, of the Eighth of May last, For paying the respective Bounties therein mentioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and also to all Able-bodied Landmen, who should voluntarily enter themselves in His Majesty's Royal Navy; and likewise for paying the Rewards to Persons discovering Seamen who should conceal themselves, is near expiring; And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, That the Bounties and Rewards thereby given, should be continued to be paid for some Time longer; — His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Seaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to such Seamen and Landmen respectively, who shall, on or before the Twelfth Day of August next, enter themselves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majesty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January 1757: And likewise, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Persons who shall, on or before the said Twelfth Day of August next, discover any Seaman or Seamen who shall conceal themselves, so as such Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majesty's Service. Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

WHEREAS adhering to the King's Enemies, by giving to them Aid or Comfort, either within his Realm, or elsewhere, is High Treason, and the Concealment thereof is Misprision of Treason;

And Whereas the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury have received Information, That a Loan of Money for that Purpose is at this Time negotiating in this Kingdom; Their Lordships do hereby promise a Reward of Two Hundred Pounds to any Person, by whose Discovery any Subject of His Majesty, or any Person residing within this Realm, shall

be convicted of lending or advancing directly or indirectly, or of causing or procuring to be so lent or advanced, or of subscribing for, or contributing to, or of soliciting or contracting for or remitting, either in Coin or Bullion, or by Bill or Bills of Exchange, or by any other Means whatsoever, any Sum or Sums of Money, to or for the Use or Purpose aforesaid. The said Reward to be paid immediately on the Conviction of every such Offender, by the Solicitor of the Treasury, without Deduction, their Lordships having given Directions for the immediate Prosecution of such Offenders.

In Pursuance of an Act of the last Session of Parliament relating to the Militia Forces in that Part of Great Britain called England, His Majesty's Lieutenant of the County of Nottingham, doth hereby summon all Persons, qualified according to the Directions of the said Act, and of a former Act passed in the Thirtieth Year of His Majesty's Reign, to serve as Officers in the Militia of the said County of Nottingham, and willing to accept Commissions therein, to meet at the Swan in Mansfield, on Tuesday the 1st Day of August, in order that every Person so qualified, and willing to accept any such Commission, may, at such Meeting, deliver his Name in Writing, or cause it to be delivered, to His Majesty's said Lieutenant, or in Case of his Absence, to such Person as shall be authorized by such Lieutenant to receive the same, specifying also the Rank in which he is willing to serve. The Deputy Lieutenants, and Gentlemen qualified to serve as Officers in the Militia in the County of Bedford, by the Act of Parliament for the better Ordering of the Militia Forces in the several Counties of that Part of Great Britain called England; and likewise such Gentlemen as are qualified to serve as Officers by the Act passed the last Session of Parliament, to explain, amend, and enforce the said first Act, are desired to meet on Tuesday the 18th Day of July Instant, at the Swan Inn in Bedford, in order that every Person qualified to serve as an Officer in the Militia of the said County, and willing to accept of a Commission, may deliver his Name in Writing, or cause it to be delivered, to His Majesty's Lieutenant for the said County, and to proceed in the farther Execution of the said Act.

The Deputy Lieutenants and Gentlemen qualified to serve as Officers in the Militia of the County of Suffolk (according to the Directions of the Act of Parliament passed in the 31st Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, An Act to explain, amend, and enforce an Act made in the 12th Session of Parliament, intituled, An Act for the better ordering of the Militia Forces in the several Counties of that Part of Great Britain called England) are desired to meet on Saturday the 22d Day of July next, at the Great White Horse in Ipswich, at Ten o'Clock in the Forenoon, in order that every Person qualified and willing to serve as an Officer in the Militia of Suffolk, may then and there deliver his Name in Writing, or cause it to be delivered to His Majesty's Lieutenant for the said County, and to proceed to put the said Acts in Execution.
