Constantinople, June 3.

HE Ramazan, which is drawing towards a Conclusion, has passed with great Quiet; and the Want of Corn, and other Provisions, has been lefs felt than for fome Months paft. The feveral repeated Prohibitions of the Sultan, concerning Drefs, has not been observed by the People, who conjectured, that all fuch Orders were not fixed for a Law, but that they might transgress them, at Will, by Degrees; however, the Grand Seignor, frequenting the Town incog. met with a Jew, whom he ordered to be feized, and cut off immediately by his own People; and the next Day fent an Armenian to the Porte, who has fince fhared the fame Fate. These Examples have occasioned great Consternation among the People, who now feem ftrict-ly to conform to thole Orders which timely Warning and Lenity could not accomplifh. The Bairam begins on the 7th Inftant, the Ministers will then be occupied with ceremonial Vifits for fome Days as ufual.

Turin, June 21. This being the Anniverfary of the Birth-day of his Royal Highness the Duke of Chablais, who enters into the eighteenth Year of his Age, it has been observed at Court in the accuftomed Manner.

Florence, June 24. On the 16th Inftant an-chored at Leghorne His Britannick Majesty's Ship the Lyme, Capt. Vernon, from the Le-vant; and on the 18th the Monmouth, the Hon. Capt. Harvey, Commander ; both which Ships failed again on the 19th.

And Whereas the Lords Commissioners of His Majefty's Treasury have received Information, That a Loan of Money for that Purpofe is at this Time negociating in this Kingdom; Their Lordships do hereby promise a Reward of Two Hundred Pounds to any Perfon, by whole Difcovery any Subject of His Majefty, or any Perfon reliding within this Realm, shall be convicted of lending or advancing directly or indirectly, or of caufing or procuring to be to lent or advanced, or of fubfcribing for, or contributing to, or of folliciting or contracting

for or remitting, either in Coin or Bullion, or by Bill or Bills of Exchange, or by any other Means whatfoever, any Sum or Sums of Money, to or for the Ule or Purpole aforefaid. The faid Reward to be paid immediately on the Conviction of every such Offender, by the Solicitor of the Treasury, without Deduction, their Lordfhips having given Directions for the immediate Profecution of fuch Offenders.
