## PRESENT,

The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Time limited by His Majefty's Order in Council, of the Eighth of May laft, For paying the respective Boun-

For paying the respective Boun-ties therein mentioned, to all Able and Ordinary Seamen, and also to all Able-bodied Landmen, who should voluntarily enter themfelves in-His Majefty's Royal Navy; and likewife for paying the Rewards to Perfons difcovering Seamen who should conceal themselves, is near expiring; And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, That the Boun-ties and Rewards thereby given, fhould be conti-nued to be paid for fome Time longer; — His Majefty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby Order, That the Bounties of Three Pounds for every Able Scaman, and of Thirty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years; and of Thirty Shillings for every Able-bodied Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, be continued to be paid to fuch Seamen and Landmen respectively, who shall, on or before the Twelsth Day of August next, enter themselves in the Royal Navy, in the Manner directed by His Majesty's Proclamation of the Fourth Day of January 1757 : And likewife, That the Rewards of Two Pounds for every Able, and Twenty Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, be continued to be paid to any Perfons who shall, on or before the faid Twelfth Day of August next, discover any Seaman or Seamen who shall conceal themselves, so as such Seaman or Seamen be taken for His Majesty's Service. Whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice, and govern themfelves accordingly.

Turin, June 28. Monday the 26th, being the Duke of Savoy's Birth-day, his Royal Highnels received the Compliments of the Foreign Ministers, and of the Nobility, as usual. The Duke of Noja, with his Son the Duke of Nocera, and his Daughter the Bride of Prince San Severino, after staying at Turin three Days, fat out for Lyons in the Night of the 25th.

Warfaw, June 28. There has been a Skirmith between a fmall Body of Pruffian Dragoons and Huffars, and a much greater Number of Coffacks, but without any confiderable Advantage on either Side. General Fermor encamps at prefent between Tuchal and Conitz, and his Van-guard is advanced as fat as the Frontiers of the New Marche.

Head Quarters at Grevenbroich, July 13. The Magazine of Forage taken in Duffeldorp, which furrendered on the 7th Inflant, is very confiderable. Prince Ferdinand has put into that Place a Gartifon of three Battalions, and has ordered a Bridge of Boats to be laid over the River, which will be finished this Day.

Cologne, July 14. Yesterday Morning the French forced the Arsenal of this Free Imperial City, and took out such Cannon as they wanted, to defend the Bridge they have built over the Rhine.

Hague, July 18. We have no direct News from the King of Pruflia's Army in Moravia; but from all other Quarters it feems agreed, that the first Accounts of the Advantage gained by the Austrians were greatly exaggerated, and that in Reality, they had gained little or no Advantage over the Pruflians. The raising the Siege of Olmutz continues to be believed; and the King of Pruflia is faid to have affembled his whole Army at Littau, without any Loss. A large Corps of Pruflians is advancing out of Silesia towards the Ruflians on one Side, whilf Count Dohna, with his Army, is marching to them on the other.
